

**In the Matter of the  
Teaching License of  
RANDALL WAYNE WALLIN**

On or about October 23, 2001, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission received a complaint from Bill Burnett, Superintendent of South Umpqua School District #19, indicating that Randall Wallin had violated his contract by failing to provide 60 days' written notice prior to resignation. The district did not include a copy of Mr. Wallin's contract and the school board's resolution to suspend his license as required under OAR 584-050-0020. Subsequently, the district submitted the resolution and contract on December 21, 2001, and the Commission notified Mr. Wallin of intent to suspend his teaching license, and his opportunity for hearing by letter dated January 28, 2002. The letter was sent by Certified Mail—Return Receipt Requested #7001 0320 0005 0740 9497. The receipt was signed by Randall W. Wallin on February 2, 2002, and returned to TSPC on February 5, 2002.

Randall Wallin resigned his teaching position with the South Umpqua School District without first providing 60 days' prior written notice to the district.

CONCLUSION OF LAW


Mr. Wallin violated ORS 342.553 by failing to provide 60 days' notice prior to resignation from his teaching position.

ORDER

The Commission suspends the Oregon Standard Teaching License of Randall Wayne Wallin through June 12, 2002.
