Before a hearing date was set, 12 the parties have agreed that their respective interest and the interests of the State are 13 best served by a Stipulation of Facts and Order of Public Reprimand and Probation as 14 set forth below. 15 16 STIPULATION OF FACTS 17 18 Lyudmila Tsytsyn (DOB 05-21-74) immigrated from the Ukraine to the United 19 1. States with her family in 1992. The family established a residence in 20 Vancouver, Washington. 21 22 Ms. Tsytsyn was convicted in October 1995 in Clark County Washington on 2. 23 Theft in the Second Degree (a felony) for theft of cash from Sears Roebuck where 24 she was employed. 25 26 Ms. Tsytsyn was required to pay financial obligations, complete community 27 3. service and serve a period of probation which ended July 8, 1998. 28 29 Ms. Tsytsyn enrolled at George Fox University in Fall 1993 as an undergraduate. 30 4. She was continuously enrolled as a full-time student through spring 1998 and 31 earned a Bachelor of Arts on May 1, 1998 with a major in music teaching. 32 33 Ms. Tsytsyn did not disclose to George Fox University that she had been 34 5. 35 convicted for Theft. She answered "no" to all TSPC character questions on her PA-1 form when registering for student teaching on December 3, 1997. 36 37 38 6. Ms. Tsytsyn answered "no" to all TSPC character questions on an application for licensure dated June 23, 1998. 39

7. Tigard-Tualatin School District offered Ms. Tsytsyn a position for 1998-99 as a music teacher. She answered "no" to the district's question, "Have you ever been convicted or plead nolo contendre to a felony?"

TSPC became aware of the arrest from the FBI report on fingerprints and 8. investigated the court disposition. Ms. Tsytsyn cooperated by providing court documents and by subsequent full disclosure to Tigard-Tualatin School District administrators.

9. Ms. Tsytsyn has conducted herself in an appropriate manner in the George Fox 50 University Teacher Education Program and has favorable recommendations from 51 program faculty and cooperating school personnel. 52
