DEFAULT ORDER  
OF REVOCATION

On July 18, 2001, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission issued a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing to Paul Raymond Yauch, in which the Commission proposed to suspend or revoke the teaching license of Paul Yauch or otherwise impose discipline under ORS 342.177. The notice was sent via U.S. First Class Mail and U.S. Certified Mail Receipt #7000 0600 0023 8496 7996 to the address Paul Yauch provided to the Commission. The notice sent via certified mail was returned to the Commission on August 6, 2001, as unclaimed. The notice sent via U.S. First Class Mail has not been returned. Paul Yauch did not request a hearing.

The Notice of Opportunity for Hearing, signed by David V. Myton, Executive Director, stated:

If a request for hearing is not received within this 21-day period, your right to hearing shall be considered waived unless your failure to request a hearing was beyond your reasonable control. If you do no request a hearing or if you fail to appear at a hearing, the Commission will adopt an Order of Default which may include the revocation or suspension of your license or other discipline.

Based on the foregoing, the Commission finds Paul Raymond Yauch in default and such default is hereby entered. Based on the records and files of the Commission, the Commission enters the following findings of fact and order.

## FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Paul Raymond Yauch holds a Basic Teaching License with an endorsement in Basic Elementary valid through January 15, 2002. Paul Yauch has been licensed by TSPC since September 1974.

2. Paul Raymond Yauch was employed by Portland Public Schools at Beaumont Middle School since January 1975. Paul Yauch's resigned before the School Board took any action.

3. On September 27, 2000, Police arrested Paul Yauch engaged in a drug deal near SE 92<sup>nd</sup> Avenue and Powell Boulevard in Portland.

4. On October 5, 2000, the Multnomah County Grand Jury indicted Paul Yauch on charges of: ORS 475.999 – Delivery of a Controlled Substance within 1000 Feet School; ORS 475.999 – Delivery of a Controlled Substance Schedule II; and ORS 475.999 – Possession of a Controlled Substance Schedule II

5. On April 17, 2001, Paul Yauch pled guilty and was convicted of Delivery of a Controlled Substance II (Commercial Drug Offense; Substantial Quantities) in Multnomah County Circuit Court for delivery of 10 or more grams of a mixture or substance containing detectable amounts of cocaine. The Court sentenced Yauch to 36 months Probation supervised by Multnomah County Corrections, with Drug, Alcohol and Additional Conditions.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Paul Yauch's actions constitute gross neglect of duty and gross unfitness in violation of ORS 342.143(1)(d) and OAR 584-020-0040(5)(c).





**NOTICE OF APPEAL OR RIGHTS**


