1 BEFORE THE TEACHER STANDARDS AND PRACTICES COMMISSION 2 OF THE STATE OF OREGON 3 In the Matter of the STIPULATION OF FACTS AND 4 Educator License of) FINAL ORDER OF PUBLIC 5 ERICK CASTILLO REPRIMAND AND PROBATION) 6 7 8 On March 18, 2017, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission 9 (Commission) received a misconduct report from the interim director of the Arco Iris 10 Charter School indicating possible professional misconduct on the part of licensed 11 educator, Erick Castillo (Castillo.) 12 After review of the matters alleged, Castillo and the Commission agree that their 13 respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to 14 certain facts, the imposition of a public reprimand, and a period of probation. 15 This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the 16 sanction to be imposed. Castillo stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the 17 Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law set 18 forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Castillo waives the right to a hearing to 19 contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below. 20 By signing below, Castillo acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to 21 the following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest 22 the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally 23 waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of Facts and Final Order of Public Reprimand and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order); 24 25 (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent 26 27 upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Castillo nor the 28 Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and 29 Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or 30 duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of 31 the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has 32 been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has 33

consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully

advised with regard to his rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an

attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of

 STIPULATION OF FACTS

- 1. The Commission has licensed Castillo since July 27, 2015. Castillo currently holds a Preliminary Teaching License, with endorsements in Elementary Multiple Subjects (PK-12) and English for Speakers of Other Languages (PK-12), valid from March 21, 2019, through March 20, 2022. During all relevant times, Castillo was employed by the Arco Iris Charter School, sponsored by the Beaverton School District (BSD). At the time the incident occurred, Castillo's child attended the Arco Iris Charter School.
- 2. On March 18, 2017, the Commission received a report from the Interim Director of the Arco Iris Charter School indicating Castillo may have committed an act of gross neglect of duty and/or gross unfitness, specifically, Castillo intimidated teachers/colleagues by yelling.
- 3. Investigation determined that on February 25, 2017, there was an emergency board meeting at the school to discuss the employment future of then principal FG. The meeting was emotional and many of the teachers and staff were upset. After the official meeting adjourned, some board members, the board's attorney, and a group of employees convened an informal meeting to discuss their positions, process the official meeting, and discuss next steps. When Castillo learned of the meeting, which he believed was occurring in violation of Oregon's public meetings law, Castillo entered the meeting.

The meeting broke up and later reconvened when participants believed Castillo had left. When Castillo learned the meeting had restarted, Castillo again entered the meeting and a verbal confrontation began that included Castillo, the Interim Principal, several Board Members and several teachers. Both Castillo and the board summoned the police. The police responded, and Castillo voluntarily left the school property when the Board president initiated a trespass notification. Immediately following the meeting, Castillo was informed that the school had terminated his employment based on Castillo's conduct.
