6 STIPULATION OF FACTS AND
7 FINAL ORDER OF
8 PUBLIC REPRIMAND

7 On February 26, 2021, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission
8 (Commission) received a report from the Willamette Education Service District (District)
9 reporting that Jason Perrins (Perrins) had been working as an administrator May 8,
10 2020, through January 26, 2021, without a valid, Oregon administrator license.

11 After review of the matters alleged, Perrins and the Commission agree that their
12 respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to
13 certain facts and the imposition of a Public Reprimand.

14 This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the
15 sanction to be imposed. In entering into this stipulation, Perrins waives the right to a
16 hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.


17 By signing below, Perrins acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to
18 the following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest
19 the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally
20 waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of
21 Facts and Final Order of Public Reprimand (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii) this
22 Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon
23 request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon and
24 subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not
25 approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Perrins nor the
26 Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and
27 Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or
28 duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of
29 the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has
30 been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has
31 consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully
32 advised with regard to his rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an
33 attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of
34 the Stipulated Final Order below.

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
STIPULATION OF FACTS

1. The Commission has licensed Perrins since November 6, 2018. Perrins held a Reciprocal Administrator License, with an endorsement in Administrator (PK-12), valid from November 6, 2018, through May 7, 2020. During all relevant times, Perrins was employed by the Willamette Education Service District (WESD).
2. On February 26, 2021, the Commission received a misconduct report from the WESD indicating Perrins may have engaged in professional misconduct which could be gross neglect of duty and/or gross unfitness. Specifically, the WESD reported that Perrins worked without a valid Oregon administrator license from May 8, 2020, through January 26, 2021.
3. Investigation found that on October 23, 2018, Perrins began employment with the WESD as Principal, Lord High School, McClaren Youth Correctional Facility. On May 1, 2020, Perrin’s Professional Educational Experience Report form for was submitted to the Commission on May 6, 2020. Perrins incorrectly determined this was the requirement for a license renewal. Perrins did not complete an application or provide the associated fee. On May 7, 2020, Perrins’ Reciprocal Administrator License expired. In late fall or early winter of the 2020-21 school year, Perrins could not locate a valid license through the Commission’s web site. After contacting the Commission by email, Perrins was notified he did not possess a valid Oregon license. On January 26, 2021, Perrins submitted an application and paid the associated fee for a Principal License. The same day, the WESD removed Perrins from his position.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

The conduct described above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use

1 professional judgment); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(r) (*Working without a license*); OAR
2 584-050-0035 (1) (*Any person employed in a position in a school district, education
3 service district, or charter school for which a license or registration is required
4 pursuant to ORS Chapter 342, must hold a valid license or registration appropriate for
5 the assignment while working as a public school, education service district or charter
6 school employee*).

7 The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon
8 ORS 342.175.

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ORDER

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
