COHEN 7 8 9 On May 25, 2022, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission) 10 issued a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing to Richard A. Cohen (Cohen) in which the 11 Commission charged him with Gross Neglect of Duty. The Notice was sent via U.S. First Class and U.S. Certified Mail, USPS Tracking Number 7021 0350 0000 8184 3279, to the 12 13 address on file with the Commission. The Notice designated the Commission file as the 14 record for purposes of proving a prima facie case. Neither the Certified Mail nor the First-Class mail was returned to the Commission, and both were assumed delivered. The Notice 15 16 of Opportunity of Hearing, dated May 25, 2022 and signed by Anthony Rosilez, Executive 17 Director, stated: 18 "IF A REQUEST FOR HEARING IS NOT RECEIVED WITHIN THIS 21-DAY PERIOD, YOUR RIGHT TO A HEARING SHALL BE CONSIDERED WAIVED 19 UNLESS YOUR FAILURE TO REQUEST A HEARING WAS BEYOND YOUR 20 21 REASONABLE CONTROL. IF YOU DO NOT REQUEST A HEARING, WITHDRAW 22 YOUR REQUEST FOR HEARING, IF YOU FAIL TO APPEAR AT A HEARING, OR 23 NOTIFY THE COMMISSION THAT YOU WILL NOT APPEAR AT HEARING, THE COMMISSION WILL ADOPT AN ORDER OF DEFAULT WHICH MAY INCLUDE 24 25 THE REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF YOUR LICENSE OR OTHER 26 DISCIPLINE." 27 28 As of July 17, 2023, the Commission has not heard from Cohen. The Commission, therefore, 29 finds Cohen to be in default and enters the following findings of fact, conclusions of law, and 30 final order, based on the files and records of the Commission concerning this matter. 31 32 FINDINGS OF FACT 1. The Commission has licensed Cohen since January 25, 2021. Cohen currently 33 34 holds a Reciprocal Teaching License, with an endorsement in Special Education – 35 Generalist (PK-12), valid from January 25, 2021, through January 25, 2022. 36 During all relevant times, Cohen was employed by the Tigard-Tualatin School 37 District. (TTSD).

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- 2. On September 29, 2019, the Commission received a School District Misconduct Report from the TTSD. The report alleges that Cohen exhibited concerning behaviors to include talking over people, interrupting, being unorganized, not responding to emails, and generally erratic behavior. The report also mentioned that Cohen failed to follow the Oregon Governor's COVID safety protocols/mask mandate and sent a threatening message to an Instructional Assistant (IA) via text message.

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3. An investigation conducted by TTSD substantiated the allegations, and determined the following facts:

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On Friday, September 24, 2021, Cohen was called to the office by the Director of Student Services to discuss why he was not adhering to COVID protocols and the Governor's mask mandate. Cohen refused to attend the meeting as directed and left the building without telling anyone where he was going. TTSD determined that Cohen was insubordinate in his actions.

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On Friday, September 24, 2021, Cohen sent a threatening text message to his IA, because he believed she had turned him in to school administration for failing to adhere to COVID protocols. The text message Cohen wrote reads as follows:

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"You are a two- faced lying bitch. You are not a good Christian woman you are the devil's helper. I trusted you and you ruined me and you hurt the kids in the process. You just want to be the center of attention. A child who is a defensive little hurt girl. I worked my ass off to make that classroom what it is today. You called parents and turned them on me and you think you are the greatest thing in the world but you are an evil spirited, selfish child. You wait till the parents start complaining that I've been used and manipulated by you and the student services team of

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Satan loving assholes. I hope you suffer and wallow in your shit, the pathetic lies and fake smiles you wear. I hope you burn in hell."

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For this action, the school determined that Cohen was a risk to school safety and trespassed him from all TTSD facilities.

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 On September 17, 2021, despite several warnings by TTSD administration, Cohen failed to properly wear his required KN95 mask per COVID protocols, and the Governor's mask mandate order.

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For the incidents listed above, the TTSD trespassed Cohen from TTSD grounds, and began the employee termination process. Cohen resigned his position with TTSD on September 25, 2021.

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4. On February 22, 2022, TSPC investigative staff conducted a telephone interview with Cohen. During the interview, Cohen reported that he was the only one required to wear a KN95 mask at the TTSD due to his unvaccinated status. Cohen reported that he felt like he "honored" the COVID and masking protocols and reported that no one at the school had ever approached him and complained about him not wearing a mask or wearing a mask inappropriately. During the interview, Cohen admitted to sending the threatening text message to his IA but reported that what he had done was unprofessional and was done in anger. Cohen reported that he doesn't feel like his actions were harmful enough to justify taking away his teaching license. Cohen reported that he should have taken a moment to calm down and stated that he had never been through anything like this before and stated that he believed the IA's actions of reporting her concerns about him was "affecting kids negatively." Cohen also reported that on September 24, 2021, he had intentionally ignored the directive to come to the office of the Director of Student Services for a meeting because he believed that the Director was "out to get him" and "didn't like him." Cohen admitted that after receiving the directive, he used the bathroom, and then left the building. Cohen

1	stated that he left a note in his classroom indicating his intentions to resign.
2	Cohen reported that he had done this because he wanted to "protect" himself and
3	his pride.
4	CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
5	The conduct described above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS
6	342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-
7	0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations).
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9	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS
10	342.175.
11	FINAL ORDER
12	The Commission hereby issues a ninety (90) day suspension and one year (1)
13	probation upon Cohen's Oregon educator license. Furthermore, Cohen will be required to
14	complete an approved Anger Management program prior to reinstatement.
