26	On August 1, 2022, the Commission received a telephone call from Daniels. Daniels asserted	he
27	did not want a hearing and he did not want to participate in the disciplinary process. The	
28	Commission, therefore, finds Daniels to be in default and enters the following findings of fact	t,
29	conclusions of law, and final order, based on the files and records of the Commission	
30	concerning this matter.

32	FINDINGS OF FACT	
33	1. On December 17, 2021, Daniels submitted an application with the Commission for a	
34	Restricted Substitute Teaching License.	
35		
36	2. On Daniels' application, he answered "NO" to character questions relating to past	
37	criminal activity, adverse action, and discipline taken against him.

3. In late January 2022, Commission staff conducted a routine background investigation initiated by Daniels' submission of an application. Staff learned during the background check that while Daniels was serving in the US Air Force (USAF), he was arrested on multiple charges, one of which involved possessing and viewing child pornography. Daniels' application was placed on hold pending resolution of this matter.

4. Investigation found Daniels was arrested by the USAF on multiple charges. In a court-martial held in early 2003, Daniels plead guilty to and was convicted of misuse of a government computer and possession and viewing of child pornography in early 2003.

5. Daniels failed to disclose on his application and letter of explanation the nature of the charges which resulted in his arrest, conviction and separation from the USAF.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Wayne E. Daniels' criminal convictions constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment); and OAR 584-020-0040(1) (The Commission will deny, revoke or deny the right to apply for a license or charter school registration to any applicant or educator who, has been convicted of any of the crimes listed in ORS 342.143, or the substantial equivalent of any of those crimes if convicted in another jurisdiction), including ORS 163.686 Encouraging Child Sex Abuse in the Second Degree. This conduct also constitutes gross unfitness in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(c); OAR 584-020-0040(5)(c) (Conviction of violating any federal, state, or local law. A conviction includes any final judgment of conviction by a court whether as the result of guilty plea, no contest plea or any other means); OAR 584-020-0040(5)(d) (Commission of an act listed in OAR 584-020-0040(1)); and OAR 584-020-0040(5)(e) (Admission of or engaging in acts constituting criminal conduct, even in the absence of a conviction.

Pursuant to ORS 342.175(3) and OAR 584-020-0040(1) the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission must deny Daniels' application and revoke his right to apply for a license based on conviction of any of the crimes listed in ORS 342.143(3)(a), or the substantial equivalent of any of those crimes, or convicted of attempt to commit such crimes as defined in ORS 161.405.

Daniels' criminal conviction constitutes gross unfitness in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(c); OAR 584-020-0040(3)(c) and (d) as defined by OAR 584-020-0040 (5) (Gross unfitness is any conduct which renders an educator unqualified to perform his or her

1	professional responsibilities).
2	Daniels' conduct underlying his conviction, as described in section three (3) above,
3	constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as
4	it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment); and OAR 584-020-
5	0040(4)(0) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(3)(a) (Maintain the dignity of the profession
6	by respecting and obeying the law, exemplifying personal integrity and honesty).
7	Daniels conduct as described in section two (2) above constitutes gross neglect of duty in
8	violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-
9	0010(5) (Use professional judgment); OAR 584-020-0040(0) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-
10	0035(3)(a) (Maintain the dignity of the profession by respecting and obeying the law,
11	exemplifying personal integrity and honesty); and OAR 584-020-0040(4)(c) (Falsification of
12	any document or knowing misrepresentation directly related to licensure, employment, or
13	professional duties)
14	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS
15	342.175.
16	
17	FINAL ORDER
18	The Commission hereby denies the application of Daniels and revokes Daniels' right to
19	apply for an Oregon educator licensure.
