13	prima facie case. The return rece	ipt for the Notice sent Certified Mail was signed on March 13, 2023,		
14	and returned to the Commission.	The regular First Class Mail was not returned to the Commission		
15	and assumed delivered. The Notice of Opportunity of Hearing, dated February 22, 2023, and signed			
16	by Anthony Rosilez, Executive Director, stated:

31		FINDINGS OF FACT		
32	1. The Commission has	licensed Sean K. Fuller since August 18, 2014. Fuller holds a		
33	Preliminary Teaching	License, with endorsements in Social Studies (PK-12) and		
34	Elementary- Multiple	Subjects (PK-12), valid from April 17, 2020, through November 22,		
35	• •	ant times, Fuller was employed by the Phoenix-Talent School		
36	District (PTSD).

38	•	commission received a report from the PTSD indicating Fuller was		
39	arrested and charged	with criminal conduct that could constitute a violation of

1		Commission rules. Specifically, the District reported Fuller was arrested on multiple
2		felony counts relating to sexual abuse and incest.
3		
4	3.	Law enforcement investigation determined that Fuller sexually abused a minor who
5		was a family member.
6		
7	4.	On April 6, 2022, Fuller was arrested and charged with four (4) felony counts of Sexual
8		Abuse in the Second Degree, and one (1) felony count of Incest and on April 12, 2022,
9		Fuller was indicted on the same counts. On October 5, 2022, by plea agreement, Fuller
10		was convicted of two (2) felony counts of Sexual Abuse in the Second Degree. On
11		October 5, 2022, Fuller was sentenced to a total of twenty (20) months in prison,
12		required to register as a sex offender, given post-prison supervision for five (5) years,
13		and required to pay restitution.
14		
15		
16	Sean K. Fuller's criminal conviction as described section four (4) above, constitute gross	
17	neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR	
18	584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment); and OAR 584-020-0040(1) (The Commission will	
19	deny, revoke or deny the right to apply for a license or charter school registration to any applicant	
20	or educator who, has been convicted of any of the crimes listed in ORS 342.143, or the substantial	
21	equivalent of any of those crimes if convicted in another jurisdiction), including ORS 163.425	
22	Sexual Abuse in the Second Degree and ORS 163.525 Incest. This conduct also constitutes gross	
23	unfitness in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(c); OAR 584-020-0040(5)(c) (Conviction of violating any	
24	federal, state, or local law. A conviction includes any final judgment of conviction by a court	
25	whether as the result of guilty plea, no contest plea or any other means); OAR 584-020-0040(5)(d)	
26	(Commission of an act listed in OAR 584-020-0040(1)); and OAR 584-020-0040(5)(e) (Admission	
27	of or engag	ging in acts constituting criminal conduct, even in the absence of a conviction).
28		
29	Pur	suant to ORS 342.175(3) and OAR 584-020-0040(1) the Teacher Standards and Practices
30	Commission must revoke Fuller's license and/or his right to apply for a license based on his	
31	conviction of any of the crimes listed in ORS 342.143(3)(a), or the substantial equivalent of any of	
32	those crimes, or convicted of attempt to commit such crimes as defined in ORS 161.405.

35	Ful	ler's conduct underlying his conviction, as described in section three (3) and four (4)

1	above, constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n)		
2	as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment); and OAR 584-020-		
3	0040(4)(0) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0035(3)(a) (Maintain the dignity of the profession by		
4	respecting and obeying the law, exemplifying personal integrity and honesty).		
5			
6	Additionally, Fuller's criminal conviction and conduct related to his conviction constitute		
7	"gross unfitness" in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(c); OAR 584-020-0040(3)(c) and (d) as defined by		
8	OAR 584-020-0040 (5) (Gross unfitness is any conduct which renders an educator unqualified to		
9	perform his or her professional responsibilities).		
10			
11	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS 342.175.		
12			
13	FINAL ORDER		
14	The Commission hereby revokes Sean K. Fuller's Oregon Educator license.
