8 On June 24, 2022, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission
9 (Commission) received a report from the David Douglas School District (District)
10 alleging that James M. Avino (Avino) made inappropriate comments to staff and
11 students during the 2021-22 school year at Ron Russell Middle School.

After review of the matters alleged, Avino and the Commission agree that their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to certain facts, the imposition of a Public Reprimand on Avino's license, and a two (2) year period of Probation.

16 This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the 17 sanction to be imposed. In entering into this stipulation, Avino waives the right to a 18 hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below. 19 By signing below, Avino acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the 20 following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest the 21 findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally 22 waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of 23 Facts and Final Order of Public Reprimand and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order); 24 (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent 25 26 upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does 27 not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Avino nor the 28 Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and 29 Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or 30 duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of 31 the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has 32 33 consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully 34 advised with regard to his rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an 35 attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of 36 the Stipulated Final Order below.

2	1.	The Commission has licensed Avino since August 16, 1991. Avino holds a	
3		Professional Teaching License, with endorsements in Social Studies (PK-12) and	
4	: .	Special Education – Generalist (PK-12), valid from October 24, 2019, to February	
5		4, 2025. During all relevant times, Avino was employed by the David Douglas	
6		School District (DDSD).	
7	2.	On June 24, 2022, the Commission received a report from the DDSD indicating	
8		Avino may have committed acts which constitute gross neglect of duty and/or	
9		gross unfitness. Specifically, the report alleged that during the 2021-22 school	
10	. 1	year, Avino made inappropriate comments to students and staff at Ron Russel	
11		Middle School.	
12	3.	Investigation determined that during the 2021-22 school year, Avino made	
13		inappropriate comments to a classroom assistant and to students on several	
14		occasions. Avino made comments to female students in his classes about their	
15		appearance and referred to them with pet names. These comments made the	
16		students uncomfortable. Avino made comments to his classroom assistant which	
17		made the assistant uncomfortable and were made in front of students.	
18	4.	On May 13, 2022, the DDSD placed Avino on administrative leave pending the	
19		outcome of the district investigation into the matter. During Avino's District	
20		interview on May 31, 2022, Avino admitted to making some inappropriate	
21		comments to students and staff, or that he did not recall specific comments but	
22		that the comments and conversations could have happened. During Avino's	
23		Commission interview on June 13, 2023, Avino admitted to making some	
24		inappropriate comments to students and staff.

3	in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-		
4	020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0020(2)(d) (Skill in the		
5	supervision of students), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and		
6	reasonable rules and regulations); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(0) as it incorporates OAR		
7	584-020-0035(1)(c)(D) (Honoring appropriate adult boundaries with students in		
8	conduct and conversations at all times).		
9	The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon		
10	ORS 342.175.

12	ORDER		
13	The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and		
14	conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a Public Reprimand upon James M.		
15	Avino's Oregon educator license.		
16	Furthermore, the Commission imposes a period of two (2) years of probation		
17	upon Avino's Oregon educator license and subject to the following conditions:		
18	1. Avino shall comply with the Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance of		
19	Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division		
20	020.
