4 5 6 7	In the Matter of the DARREN M. BLAND  STIPULATION OF FACTS AND FINAL ORDER OF SUSPENSION AND PROBATION	
8	On September 21, 2022, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission	
9	(Commission) received a report from the Corvallis School District (District) indicating	
10	Darren M. Bland (Bland) may have committed an act of gross neglect of duty and/or	
11	gross unfitness. Specifically, the district reported Bland stole medication for a student	
12	which was stored at Crescent Valley High School, and Bland was under the influence of	
13	intoxicants at school.	
14	After review of the matters alleged, Bland and the Commission agree that their	
15	respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to	j
16	certain facts and the imposition of a twelve (12) month suspension and a period of	
17	Probation for three (3) years.	
18	This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the	
19	sanction to be imposed. Bland stipulates that there are sufficient facts contained in the	
20	Commission's files and records to support the findings of fact and conclusions of law se	t
21	forth below. In entering into this stipulation, Bland waives the right to a hearing to	
22	contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below.	
23	By signing below, Bland acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and agrees to the	1e
24	following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing to contest the	e
25	findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully and finally	
26	waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Stipulation of	f
27	Facts and Final Order of Suspension and Probation (Stipulation and Final Order); (ii)	
28	this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public upon	
29	request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent upon an	d
30	subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not	
31	approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Bland nor the	
32	Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and	
33	Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or	
34	duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry	of
35	the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has	
36	been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has	

consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully advised with regard to his rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of the Stipulated Final Order below.

## STIPULATION OF FACTS

- 1. The Commission has licensed Bland since August 6, 2001. Bland held an Administrative License, with an endorsement in Principal (PK-12), valid from January 1, 2020, through December 31, 2022. Bland also held a Professional Teaching License, with an endorsement in English Language Arts (PK-12), valid from June 11, 2017, through January 1, 2023. On January 7, 2023, Bland submitted applications for renewal of his teacher and administrator licenses. Bland's applications were held pending the outcome of this matter. During all relevant times, Bland was employed by the Corvallis School District (CSD).
- 2. On September 21, 2022, the Commission received a misconduct report from the CSD indicating Bland may have committed acts which constitute gross neglect of duty and/or gross unfitness. The CSD alleged that on September 16, 2022, Bland stole a student's medication, which was stored at Cresent Valley High School (CVHS). The CSD also alleged Bland was under the influence of intoxicants at CVHS during work hours on at least one occasion in September 2022.
- 3. Investigation found that during the COVID-19 lockdowns of 2020, Bland became concerned about effectively educating students remotely and one of Bland's immediate family members passed. Bland was emotionally distraught and sought medical assistance. Bland was prescribed medication to assist in managing his situation.
- 4. Investigation found on September 19, 2022, CSD staff learned a student's medication, which was secured in a medicine locker in the health office at CVHS, was missing. District officials reviewed video of the area and identified Bland as being in the area on September 16, 2022. The District reported the matter to local law enforcement.
- 5. Investigation by law enforcement found that on September 16, 2022, Bland entered the CVHS health office on multiple occasions. During an interview, Bland admitted that on one those occasions, he entered the health office, broke into the locked medicine locker, and stole Adderall pills from student medication bottles. On another

of those occasions, Bland admitted entering the health office and removing the empty bottles of student medication.

- 6. During law enforcement's initial response to the missing medication at CVHS on September 19, 2022, the responding officer believed Bland was under the influence of intoxicants when he observed Bland in the hallway at the school. Bland later admitted to misusing his medication at school during work hours on that date.
- On September 19, 2022, Bland was placed on administrative leave pending the
  outcome of the District's investigation into the matter. On September 23, 2022, Bland
  resigned in lieu of termination.
- 8. On September 26, 2022, Bland was charged in Benton County Circuit Court with four criminal counts related to theft of the medication. On May 19, 2023, Bland entered a plea agreement and was convicted of one misdemeanor count of Official Misconduct in the First Degree and one misdemeanor count of Theft in the Third Degree. Bland was sentenced to ninety (90) days jail, suspended; five (5) years bench probation; fined; required to undergo substance abuse treatment; and required to submit to random drug tests for cause by the court, law enforcement or a treatment provided.
- 9. On September 29, 2022, days after Bland resigned his position with the CSD, he voluntarily began inpatient substance abuse treatment. After successfully completing this treatment in late November 2022, Bland enrolled in an intensive outpatient treatment program, which he completed in June 2023.

## CONCLUSION OF LAW

Darren M. Bland's conduct as described in section four (4) above constitutes gross neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations); and OAR 584-

1 020-0035(3)(a) (Maintain the dignity of the profession by respecting and obeying the 2 law, exemplifying personal integrity and honesty). 3 Darren M. Bland's conduct as described in section six (6) above constitutes gross 4 neglect of duty in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it 5 incorporates OAR 584-020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-6 0025(2)(e) (Using district lawful and reasonable rules and regulations), and OAR 584-7 020-0040(4)(g) (Appearing on duty or at any district-sponsored activity while under 8 the influence of alcohol or any controlled substance). 9 Darren M. Bland's conduct as described in section eight (8) above constitutes 10 gross unfitness in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(c); OAR 584-020-0040(5)(c) (Conviction 11 of violating any federal, state or local law) and OAR 584-020-0040(5)(d) (Admission 12 of or engaging in acts constituting criminal conduct, even in the absence of a 13 conviction). 14 The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon 15 ORS 342.175. 16 17 ORDER 18 The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and 19 conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a twelve (12) month suspension upon 20 Darren M. Bland's Oregon educator licenses. Upon reinstatement, there will be a three 21 (3) year period of Probation on Bland's Oregon educator license(s). 22 Furthermore, Bland is subject to the following conditions prior to reinstatement 23 of his Oregon educator license(s): 24 1.
