## 1 BEFORE THE TEACHER STANDARDS AND PRACTICES COMMISSION 2 OF THE STATE OF OREGON 3 In the Matter of the STIPULATION OF FACTS AND 4 Educator License of FINAL ORDER OF ) 5 PUBLIC REPRIMAND MARK L. MARCANTONIO ) 6 7 On November 7, 2022, the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission 8 (Commission) received a patron complaint alleging misconduct between Mark L. 9 Marcantonio (Marcantonio) and a student which occurred during class at Visitation 10 Catholic School between 2001 and 2003. 11 Marcantonio fully cooperated with the Commission's investigation into this 12 matter. After review of the matters alleged, Marcantonio, while denying the allegations, 13 and the Commission agree that their respective interests, together with the public 14 interest, are best served by a stipulation to certain facts and the imposition of a Public 15 Reprimand. 16 This Order sets forth the facts upon which the parties have agreed and the 17 sanction to be imposed. In entering into this stipulation, Marcantonio waives the right to 18 a hearing to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law and order set forth below. 19 By signing below, Marcantonio acknowledges, understands, stipulates, and 20 agrees to the following: (i) he has been fully advised of his rights to notice and a hearing 21 to contest the findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order set forth below, and fully 22 and finally waives all such rights and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this 23 Stipulation of Facts and Final Order of Public Reprimand (Stipulation and Final Order); 24 (ii) this Stipulation and Final Order is a public document and disclosed to the public 25 upon request by the Commission; (iii) this Stipulation and Final Order is contingent 26 upon and subject to approval and adoption by the Commission. If the Commission does not approve and adopt this Stipulation and Final Order, then neither Marcantonio nor 27 the Commission are bound by the terms herein; (iv) he has fully read this Stipulation and 28 Final Order, and understands it completely; (v) he voluntarily, without any force or 29 duress, enters into this Stipulation and Final Order and consents to issuance and entry of 30 31 the Stipulated Final Order below; (vi) he states that no promise or representation has 32 been made to induce him to sign this Stipulation and Final Order; and (vii) he has consulted with an attorney regarding this Stipulation and Final Order and has been fully 33

advised with regard to his rights thereto, or waives any and all rights to consult with an

attorney prior to entering into this Stipulation and Final Order and issuance and entry of
 the Stipulated Final Order below.

## STIPULATION OF FACTS

- 1. The Commission has licensed Marcantonio since November 14, 2001. Marcantonio held a Professional Teaching License, with an endorsement in Social Studies (PK-12), valid from October 17, 2017, through August 30, 2022. On January 18, 2023, Marcantonio submitted an application an Oregon teaching license. Marcantonio's application was pended until the Commission made a decision regarding their investigation. During all relevant times, Marcantonio was employed by Visitation Catholic School (VCS), Forest Grove, Oregon or the Spray School District.
  - On November 7, 2022, the Commission received a patron complaint alleging
    misconduct conduct between Marcantonio and a student which occurred
    approximately twenty (20) years ago, between 2001 and 2003, at VCS.
  - 3. Investigation determined that from 2001 and 2003, Marcantonio occasionally called male students to the front of the class and pulled the students' pants in an upward direction. Multiple students recalled students laughing at these interactions, and that it also appeared to embarrass the students whose pants were pulled upwards. Investigation was unable to associate this behavior by Marcantonio's to the student identified in the patron complaint.
- 4. Investigation determined that Marcantonio's Preliminary Teaching License expired on August 30, 2022. While Marcantonio was unlicensed, he began teaching at the start of the 2022-2023 school year for the Spray School District. Marcantonio acknowledges an issue related to the timeliness of applying for a license renewal can be partially attributed to reminder emails sent by the Commission which were directed to his email account's "junk mail" folder.

## 1 CONCLUSION OF LAW 2 The conduct described in section three (3) above constitutes gross neglect of duty 3 in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-4 020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment), OAR 584-020-0010(1) (Recognize the worth 5 and dignity of all persons and respect for each individual), OAR 584-020-0020(2)(d) 6 (Skill in the supervision of students), and OAR 584-020-0030(2)(b) (Skill in 7 communicating with administrators, students, staff, parents, and other patrons). 8 The conduct described in section four (4) above constitutes gross neglect of duty 9 in violation of ORS 342.175(1)(b); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(n) as it incorporates OAR 584-10 020-0010(5) (Use professional judgment); OAR 584-020-0040(4)(r) (Working without 11 a license); and OAR 584-050-0035 (1) (Any person employed in a position in a school 12 district, education service district, or charter school for which a license or registration 13 is required pursuant to ORS Chapter 342, must hold a valid license or registration 14 appropriate for the assignment while working as a public school, education service 15 district or charter school employee). 16 The Commission's authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon 17 ORS 342.175. 18 19 ORDER The Commission adopts and incorporates herein the above findings of fact and 20 21 conclusions of law, and based thereon, imposes a Public Reprimand on Mark L. 22 Marcantonio's Oregon educator license. 23 day of April 2023. 24 Issued and dated this 25 TEACHER STANDARDS AND PRACTICES COMMISSION 26 STATE OF OREGON 27 28 29 Dr. Anthony Rosilez, Executive Director
