**Information on Providing Public Comments.**

When an agency proposes to adopt, amend or repeal a rule, it shall give interested persons reasonable opportunity to submit data or views. Due to budget reductions, the Commission is no longer conducting a separate hearing on each rule. However, interested parties may provide written comments to the Commission via the email address above. Additionally, opportunity for oral hearing shall be granted upon request received from 10 persons or from an association having not less than 10 members before the earliest date that the rule could become effective after the giving of notice.

Vickie Chamberlain, Executive Director, serves as the Commission's hearing officer in the event a hearing is requested. If held, the hearing will be recorded for permanent record. The hearing officer will open the hearing and read the OAR number and its intention or purpose. The hearing officer will ask those in attendance for oral testimony. Those individuals will be heard. If there is written testimony at this time, it may be submitted.

## Reduction in Fingerprinting Fee

#### ADOPTION of TEMPORARY RULE Oregon Administrative Rules

#### TEACHER STANDARDS AND PRACTICES COMMISSION April 24, 2015

The Teacher Standards and Practices Commission adopted the following TEMPORARY rule. The temporary rule was filed with the Secretary of State and became effective on **April 23, 2015**. The Commission will refer the rule to public comment at its June 2015 meeting and consider adopting as a permanent rule at its November 2015 meeting.

Summary of rule change: OAR 584-060-0682, *Restricted Substitute Teaching License*, is being amended to allow districts applying after January 1 of the school year to extend the license until the following June 30. There are also some edits to improve clarity. The rule was adopted as a temporary rule to allow for the new provisions to be immediately implemented. The rule changes will remain in place until the Commission can consider them for permanent adoption at its November 2015 meeting.

**Restricted Substitute Teaching License**

## ADOPTION of Temporary Oregon Administrative Rules

(1) Upon filing a correct and complete application in form and manner prescribed by the Commission, a qualified applicant and a co-applying district or districts may be granted a Restricted Substitute Teaching License.

(a) The Restricted Substitute Teaching License is valid for substitute teaching at any level in any specialty to replace a teacher who is temporarily unable to work.

### Restricted Substitute Temporary Rule Filing

Released on: Friday, May 15, 2015

The Teacher Standards and Practices Commission has adopted a temporary rule related to the Restricted Substitute Teaching License. The temporary rule is effective from May 15, 2015 to November 10, 2015.

In response to current substitute teacher shortages, the agency has made the following changes to the Restricted Substitute Teaching License. The primary changes to the rule are as follows:

The Restricted Substitute Teaching License holder will be able to substitute in all Oregon K-12 district, including educational service districts – not just the sponsoring district's schools as required under current rule;

The first Restricted Substitute Teaching License will continue to be limited to a year (or up 18 months if application received after Jan 1 of the academic year). Upon renewal, however, the term of the Restricted Substitute Teaching License is **three** years. (The license will still expire on June 30 to avoid mid-school year license disruptions).

To renew, the applicant must keep the original district sponsor and apply before the license expires. If the license expires prior to renewal or the applicant has a new district sponsor, the applicant will be issued a first Restricted Substitute Teaching license again.

If the district requires the service of the substitute immediately and is waiting on examination scores, the applicant and district sponsor may apply for an Emergency Teaching License with a substitute endorsement.

Other provisions were reordered and amended for clarity.

The agency has adopted the new licensure requirements as a temporary rule so that districts may start operating under the new provisions immediately. The Commission will consider sending out the temporary changes for public comment at its June 22-24, 2015 meeting. It will consider adopting the temporary changes as a permanent rule at its November Commission meeting.

#### **Restricted Substitute Teaching License**

(1) The Restricted Substitute Teaching License is a license that permits a qualified individual to substitute teach in Oregon public K-12 classrooms with the restriction that the individual must obtain and maintain district sponsorship.

(2) The Restricted Substitute Teaching License is valid for substitute teaching assignments as follows:

(a) The Restricted Substitute Teaching License is valid for substitute teaching in any Oregon K-12 classroom to replace a teacher who is temporarily unable to work;

(b) The Restricted Substitute Teaching License is valid for substitute assignments in any Oregon school district, including education service districts; and

(c) Any single assignment on the Restricted Substitute Teaching License may not exceed 10 days consecutively under any circumstances. [See subsection (6) below for further information.]

(3) The length of the term of the Restricted Substitute Teaching License is subject to the following:

(a) **First Restricted Substitute Teaching License:** The applicant and co-applicant district's **first** Restricted Substitute Teaching License is valid through June 30 of the school year for which it is issued. For applications received after January 1, the first Restricted Substitute Teaching License may be issued through June 30 of the following school year at the request of the co-applicant district;

(b) The Restricted Substitute Teaching License may be renewed upon application from the applicant and co-applicant district. The renewed Restricted Substitute Teaching License is valid for three

years. The license will expire on June 30 of the third academic year following the issuance of the license; and

(c) The Restricted Substitute Teaching License may be continuously renewed so long as the applicant maintains an active Restricted Substitute Teaching License with the original sponsoring district and meets the requirements of subsection (5) of this rule. If the renewed Restricted Substitute Teaching License expires or the applicant co-applies with a new district sponsor, the applicant will be issued a first Restricted Substitute Teaching License as provided in subsection 3(a) of this rule.

(4) To be eligible to apply for a Restricted Substitute Teaching License, an applicant must:

(a) Possess the personal qualifications for licensure including attainment of at least eighteen years of age and possessing good moral character and mental and physical health necessary for employment as an educator;

(b) Hold a bachelor's degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution or an approved foreign equivalent. Awarding of a higher degree in the arts and sciences or an advanced degree in the professions from a regionally accredited institution in the United States validates a non-regionally accredited bachelor's degree for licensure;

(c) Pass all criminal and professional background checks pursuant to OAR 584-036-0062 *Criminal Records and Professional Conduct Background Check*;

(d) Obtain a passing score on a Commission-approved test of knowledge of U.S. and Oregon civil rights and professional ethics;

(e) Provide a complete and correct application to the Commission. A complete and correct application for a Restricted Substitute Teaching License must include:

(A) A letter from the co-applicant district stating the reasons for the license and specifying the school year(s) requested;

(B) Fingerprints in the manner prescribed unless the applicant has been fingerprinted and cleared by the Commission or has held an active license issued by the Commission in the past three years;

(C) Evidence of a passing score on a Commission-approved test of knowledge of U.S. and Oregon civil rights and professional ethics;

(D) Transcripts evidencing a bachelor's degree or higher consistent with subsection (4)(b) of this rule; and

(E) Payment of all required fees as provided in OAR 584-036-0055.

(5) Renewal Requirements: To be eligible to apply for renewal of the Restricted Substitute Teaching License, an applicant must:

(a) Submit a letter from the district requesting renewal and affirming continued co-sponsorship of the license;

(b) Obtain passing score as currently specified by the Commission on a test of basic verbal and computational skills, unless the applicant has a master's degree or higher; **(First Renewal Only)**

(c) Complete professional development units in accordance with OAR chapter 584, division 90; and

(d) Submit a complete and correct renewal application in the form and manner required by the Commission.

(6) Emergency Teaching License: A district and co-applicant educator may apply for an Emergency Teaching License with a substitute teaching endorsement for the holder of a Restricted Substitute Teaching License if the district is unable to obtain a regularly licensed teacher for any position lasting more than ten consecutive days or in cases in which the applicant has taken the test, but has not obtained a passing score on the Commission-approved civil rights and ethics test. The Executive Director may determine the term and approve the Emergency Teaching License if the district and co-applicant meet the requirements set forth in OAR 584-060-0210, *Emergency Teaching License*.

The temporary rules are effective 07/1/2015 through 12/27/2015. The Secretary of State will published the new temporary rules on its website on August 1, 2015. The Commission will consider adopting the temporary rules as permanent rules at its November 5, 2015 meeting.

SUMMARY OF MAJOR RULE CHANGES:

Substitute Crisis: Effective July 1, 2015, substitutes are no longer required to submit verification of PDUs earned to renew. Please read further for more information.

In 2013, the Commission added a requirement that all substitute teachers would be required to earn Professional Development Units (PDUs) to renew a substitute license. In the Spring of 2015, school districts and educational service districts brought information to the Commission pointing to a severe substitute teacher shortage in most areas of Oregon. In response to the potential crisis, the Commission decided to rescind the Professional Development Unit (PDU) requirement for substitutes, with the provision to revisit the issue in Spring of 2017. Depending on the impact of this change on the supply of substitute teachers, the Commission may rule to once again require Professional Development for renewal of a Substitute License.

Basic Skills Test: The Basic (Essential) Skills Testing is eliminated as a requirement for all licenses.

Licensure Redesign: Phase One: Beginning in 2012, the Commission convened a special committee to evaluate the current system of licensure and make recommendations to consolidate and simplify the two licensure systems currently operating (1965-1999 Basic/Standard and 1999 to present Initial/Continuing). These temporary rules are the first phase of implementing the work of the committee as approved by the Commission. Further technical assistance will be made available as we work to implement the changes into our daily operations.

The Teacher Standards and Practices Commission adopted the following TEMPORARY rule changes at its meeting on August 17, 2015. The temporary rules were filed with the Secretary of State and became effective on August 20, 2015. Each rule is linked to a copy of temporary rule (in amended, suspended or new form). The temporary rules are effective 08/20/2015 through 12/27/2015. The Commission will consider adopting the temporary rules as permanent rules at its November 5, 2015 meeting.

**SUMMARY OF MAJOR RULE CHANGES:**

Licensure Redesign: Phase One: Beginning in 2012, the Commission convened a special committee to evaluate the current system of licensure and make recommendations to consolidate and simplify the two licensure systems currently operating (1965-1999 Basic/Standard and 1999 to present Initial/Continuing). As part of this process, the Commission a “phase one” of licensure redesign implementation this summer to prepare for full implementation of license redesign rules on January 1, 2016. During the phase one of licensure redesign, the agency discovered that some of the licensure redesign rules related to the moving from the Initial I license to the Professional Teaching License could not be implemented as intended. In response to this new information, the Commission voted to allow the completion of a 25 PDUs per year in accordance with teacher’s employment professional development plans as a method for advancing to the Professional Teaching License. In summary, the requirements for obtaining the Professional Teaching License are as follows: *(Please note: The following is just a summary; please refer to the actual temporary rules for the complete requirements.)*

To qualify for the Professional Teaching License, an applicant must:

Have completed full four years of teaching experience; and

Provide evidence of advanced educator competencies through one of the following methods:

- 1) Completion of an advanced professional development plan in collaboration with your employing school district (25 PDUs per year); **or**
- 2) Admission to and completion of an education-related educational specialist, masters or doctoral degree program from a regionally accredited provider; **or**
- 3) Admission to and completion of a Commission-approved subject matter endorsement program; **or**
- 4) Admission to and completion of a Commission-approved specialization program; **or**
- 5) Admission to and completion of a Commission-approved advanced licensure program; **or**
- 6) Completion of the National Board of Professional Teaching Standards certification; **or**
- 7) Completion of a Professional Certificate issued by the State of Washington or other equivalent out-of-state professional teaching licenses approved by the Commission; **or**
- 8) Completion of other acceptable advanced coursework or assessment approved by the Commission.

*Applicants with Initial I Teaching Licenses issued prior to July 1, 2015 will have the option of qualifying with their previously advised requirements or the new requirements, whichever is the best option for them.*

*The Initial I Teaching License is continuously renewable. It is not mandatory to move from the Initial I Teaching License to the Professional Teaching License. The Initial I Teaching License can be renewed with 25 continuing professional development units per year of the license term.*

This week, Vickie Chamberlain announced her retirement from state service after a long and distinguished career in educational leadership. As a teacher, K-12 advocate, leader of the state’s community college association, and in her 13 years of exceptional service as Executive Director of the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission, she has served as an example of what public service truly is, and can be.

Vickie is only the third executive director in the history of TSPC since its establishment as a free-standing agency in 1973. Her professionalism and perseverance in improving educator licensing in Oregon is an example for anyone charged with such great public trust. Highlights of Vickie's many significant accomplishments include:

- Decreased the agency backlogs and increased customer service, even in difficult budget years.
- Managed an extraordinarily complex and difficult teacher licensure redesign process over the course of three years. The redesign eliminated previous inconsistencies and developed a license that is contemporary and reflects an educator's experience.
- Revised our teacher preparation licensure programs to align with national standards and began implementation of a more rigorous program review process.
- Improved cultural awareness for educators by advocating for culturally responsive pedagogy, practices and accountability measures in educator preparation. Such instruction was monitored by one of the first ethics tests in the nation for educators that included elements of culturally responsive pedagogy.
- Implemented the first on-demand web-based licensure tests in the nation for educator licensure. The system allowed for faster results and more easily scheduled testing at lower costs.
- Proposed a uniform performance assessment for all teacher preparation programs. The Commission is in the middle of implementation with a final effective date in 2018.
- Prepared for development of an online application system with an anticipated launch date of January 1, 2016.
- Increased transparency by publishing a Licensure Handbook with greater clarity regarding assignments for endorsements for the field and for educators.
- Reviewed and updated all of the administrative rules and eliminated obsolete rules; standardized rule forms and provided a clear connection between rule amendments and commission policy.
- Revised the commission meeting format so that commissioners are more actively involved in all policy discussions, licensure program approval, rule revisions and investigation determinations at the appropriate level for an active governance board.

Thirteen years is a long time in the world of state agency management and we are grateful to have had the stability of Vickie's tenure as well as her varied expertise and professional contributions.. We

#### **TEACHER STANDARDS AND PRACTICES COMMISSION** **November 15, 2015**

The Teacher Standards and Practices Commission adopted the following PERMANENT rule changes at its meeting on November 6, 2015. The permanent rules were filed with the Secretary of State and will become effective on January 1, 2016.

#### **Summary of Changes**

The Teacher Standards and Practices Commission has adopted a new design for Oregon Teaching Licenses. The goal of the redesign is to provide teachers, school districts and the public with a streamlined, simplified and more flexible licensing structure that helps support the important work that educators and schools provide Oregon's children.

Some highlights from Oregon's new Teaching License system:

- All teachers will be licensed under the same teaching license structure:
- Preliminary Teaching License (for new and novice teachers);
- Professional Teaching License (for teachers with advanced competencies and experience);
- Teacher Leader License (for teachers with demonstrated professional leadership);
- Legacy Teaching License (for veteran teachers who do not qualify for new Professional Teaching License);
- Reciprocal Teaching License (for licensed out-of-state teachers while they are working on meeting Oregon requirements);

Basic, Standard, Initial I, Initial II, Continuing, Five Year teaching licenses will be moved to new licenses.

All teaching licenses will have prekindergarten through grade 12 authorization [Authorization levels (ECE/ELE/ML/HS) are abolished].

Educators may renew the Preliminary Teaching License with 75 continuing or 75 advanced professional development units and may stay on the Preliminary Teaching License until they meet the qualifications of the Professional Teaching License.

Educators will have more options for advanced programs to move from the Preliminary Teaching License to the Professional Teaching License.

All teaching licenses will be awarded endorsements from the same list of Commission-adopted endorsements to reduce confusion in the field.

Substitutes and Restricted Substitutes will have more flexibility in assignments and educators with only substitute licenses are no longer required to do professional development;

Teaching licenses will no longer require passage of a basic skills test;

All new rules will become effective January 1, 2016. (Some of these changes were adopted as temporary rules and are currently in effect. The temporary rules will become permanent provisions on January 1, 2016.)
