**Call to Order**

Chair Dougherty called the meeting to order. The public and Workers' Compensation Board (WCB) staff members participated in the meeting by Zoom and in person in the Salem office.

## **New Business**

### **ALJ hiring consultation pursuant to ORS 656.724(1)**

Presiding Administrative Law (PALJ) Judge Jacqueline Jacobson shared that the Hearings Division had been in the process of recruiting three ALJ positions. Two of those positions would work out of the Salem and/or Portland offices (depending on the candidate and business need) and one out of the Medford office. Unfortunately, they were unsuccessful in finding a candidate for the Medford office, so the Hearings Division will continue to have ALJs from Portland and Salem travel for hearings set in Medford. However, they were successful in finding candidates for the Portland office. PALJ Jacobson recommended Christo de Villiers and Micah Moskowitz to the Board for these positions.

Christo de Villiers has been a part of the Oregon workers' compensation community since 2008. Prior to coming to Oregon, he spent approximately 13 years representing employers in employment and labor-related disputes in South Africa. Mr. de Villiers has practiced Oregon workers compensation law both as a defense attorney, including in-house counsel with Liberty Mutual, and most recently as a claimants' attorney. He will start on Monday, September 8, 2025.

Micah Moskowitz has seven years of experience serving as an ALJ with the Office of Administrative Hearings. He also has approximately seven years of experience working as a criminal defense attorney, including with the Oregon Public Defense Commission. Mr. Moskowitz will start on Monday, October 6, 2025.

Chair Dougherty opened the floor for Board Member comment. Member Ousey asked what the Hearings Division is going to do moving forward to attract a candidate to Medford? PALJ Jacobson responded that they have been following their standard recruitment process, but is open to suggestions. Member Ousey inquired further about the recruitment process for Medford, asking if only candidates who wanted to live in Medford were looked at for that Medford ALJ position. PALJ Jacobson responded that the pool of candidates were screened together and filling the Medford ALJ position was a matter of one of the top candidates wanting to work out of Medford. There were some candidates that showed interest in Medford, but they did not meet the requirements. Member Ousey thanked PALJ Jacobson for her work on recruiting these positions. Chair Dougherty also added that when these ALJ positions were posted that the previous ALJ salary (prior to the Board's most recent motion to adopt a new salary structure) was advertised. The Board is hoping that the new, higher salary structure will attract more interest for future ALJ recruitments.

Member Ceja and Member Curey thanked PALJ Jacobson for her efforts in recruiting these candidates.
