Attorney Fee Report: 2024¹

This report includes attorney fees awarded or approved by the Oregon Workers' Compensation Board (WCB) during the 2024 calendar year. WCB strives to ensure complete, transparent, and objective reporting to the fullest extent of its technical abilities. WCB has begun work to modernize its case management system and data functions. Integral to this project will be capturing statistics, including attorney fee data. WCB hopes to complete this project in the next three years.

WCB recognizes that this report is utilized for a wide range of purposes. One purpose is as a resource during the biennial attorney fee review, as required by ORS 656.388. Bearing this in mind, additional relevant information has been added to the report. For example, the Board engaged in rulemaking in 2024 that impacted attorney fees under OAR 438-015-0050(1) and OAR 438-015-0052(1). Consequently, the report includes information regarding fees issued consistent with the rules.

It is important to note that attorney fee information is entered in a manner consistent with the requirements and limitations of WCB's system. Discrepancies in the data captured by the system found previously have resulted in a dual capture system, including hand counts, in an effort to correct and verify data. WCB has started to correct data discrepancies where the data was found to be in error, and more accurate data is available and verified.

Thank you for your patience as WCB works to capture accurate and meaningful data. Special thanks to WCB and DCBS IT&R staff members who have worked diligently to gather and verify this information. If you have questions or concerns, please contact Board Chair Joy Dougherty.

Assessed Attorney Fees
Hearing Level: Opinion & Orders and Stipulations

The chart below includes attorney fees awarded in Opinion and Orders (O&Os) and includes stipulations. While attorney fees for stipulations and O&Os have historically been joined, future plans include distinguishing between the two with separate columns.

Hearing Level Litigated Cases

The chart below reflects attorney fees awarded in O&Os per litigated case at the hearing level. This information is based on hand counts.

In 2024, there were 542 case numbers coded in the following order types: Opinion and Order, Order on Reconsideration, Amended Opinion and Order, and Opinion and Order on Remand. However, 82 of those cases had more than one case number assigned to a single order. Thus, the total number of litigated cases that went to a final order at the hearings level in 2024 was 460.

In this chart, the term “all” refers to all orders in the order types listed in the above paragraph. Of those 460 orders, 211 awarded attorney fees. The 211 orders awarded a total of \$2,238,007. This is an average of \$10,606 awarded per litigated case, with a median of \$9,250. The last column captures the median fee where one or more denials was overturned.


Hearing Level Attorney Fees: Complete and Partial Claim Denials

The chart and graph below provide a history of fees awarded for cases involving an overturned claim denial. WCB captures the total fee awarded at the hearing. So, the fee amounts reflect work on all issues raised in a case not just the compensability denial. For example, the total fee awarded in a case may also include penalty-related attorney fees. Historically, the total fee awarded was then divided by the number of assigned WCB case numbers when calculating the below statistics. That approach can skew the statistics because WCB numbers can be assigned in error and run with the file, even where there is only one request for hearing. This can happen when a request for hearing is submitted via the portal and then is received some time later via the mail. WCB does not track how often this occurs. But, dividing by assigned WCB numbers affects the average fee “per case.”

To avoid this problem for the 2024 data, the total number of Opinion and Orders actually issued was used, regardless of how many case numbers were assigned. In 2024, there were 90 O&Os issued regarding complete or partial claim denials. But, those 90 O&Os had a total of 119 case numbers. For 2024, the chart uses the number of O&Os, or litigated cases, as opposed to the amount of case numbers. This provides a more accurate picture of fees awarded at hearing. Prior to 2024, the system is not able to capture the fee per “case” or issued O&Os. In those years, the calculation is and will remain divided by the number of case numbers assigned. Additionally, for 2024, the chart reflects whether the fees were modified at subsequent levels of appeal.




Stipulation Agreements with Denial Rescinded Hearings Division and Board Review

The chart and graph below shows attorney fees agreed to in stipulations approved by WCB regarding rescinded denials. The stipulations and fee awards may also include additional issues. While most of the rescissions likely occurred “pre-hearing,” some may have followed a hearing proceeding or Board review.

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
Percentage of O&Os² Resulting in an Attorney Fee Award

As noted above, WCB’s system counts by the number of case numbers not the number of O&Os issued. As a result, the O&O count below is inaccurate, with the exception of 2024, when WCB began hand counting number of orders issued. For 2024, the chart calculations have been changed to be consistent with the number of cases litigated resulting in an O&O, as opposed to the number of case numbers assigned to the case. As mentioned, the number of case numbers coded for O&Os was 542. However, only 460 O&Os issued. So, 2024 data has been adjusted accordingly.

Total Assessed Fees: Board Review

The graph below shows cases where assessed fees were awarded on Board Review. These include overturned denials awarding fees for services at the hearing level and on Board review or where the Board affirms an ALJ’s order that had set aside a denial. The calculations below remain consistent with the methodology utilized in prior years.

Settlement Agreements
Hearings and Board Review

In spring of 2024, the Workers' Compensation Board amended its rules to increase the maximum attorney fees allowed out of claims disposition agreements (CDAs) and disputed claims settlements (DCSs). These changes applied to all CDAs and DCSs filed with the Board on or after September 3, 2024. In an effort to monitor if the amendments are impacting attorney fee amounts agreed to in settlements, WCB has added this section summarizing fees related to CDAs and DCSs.



*** The Defense Legal Service costs is calculated based on WCD File Numbers. For 2024, employer and insurers reported defense costs in the amount of \$44,530,000. However, WCD file numbers that were not reported on that annual Defense Legal Services survey are given a presumed value and that value is included in the total. The estimated cost for the unreported WCD File numbers was \$1,319,542.76. This increased the total Defense Legal costs for 2024 to \$45,850,000. The number of unreported WCD file numbers is not reconciled with cases litigated before WCB.



Claimant Attorney Representation Percentage **WCB Litigation and CDAs**

This chart shows the percentage of cases and claims in which the claimant is represented by an attorney. For litigation before the Hearings Division and on Board review, this information is captured at the time of the first order at the hearings level and the first order at the Board review level. For CDAs, the information represents whether the claimant was represented by counsel at the time of the CDA submission/request for approval.

Comparison: Claimant Attorney Fees and AWW

To determine whether the changes in claimant attorney fee awards have tracked with overall changes in economic growth in Oregon, WCB created a graph comparing the average attorney fee award per case against the changes in the state average weekly wage (AWW). It was discovered that the graph utilized in this report did not actually use the AWW as determined by the Oregon Employment Department. For transparency, the old graph with prior numbers is still included this year, but will not be included next year. The corrected graph is so noted. A baseline of 2015 has been used. The average awarded attorney fees per case (at any level, including settlements) is plotted against the year-over-year percent increase in the AWW.
