The board was created by the Governor to assist in establishing and coordinating workforce programs in Oregon, including, but not limited to the implementation of the [Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act \(WIOA\)](#)¹ and [Oregon Revised Statutes 660.300 to 660.364](#)². The WTDB also functions as the primary advisory committee to the Employment Department per [Oregon Revised Statute 66.0.324](#)³.

We also want to thank you for your willingness and commitment to serve on the board as we work together to improve Oregon's workforce system and realize our vision of equitable prosperity for all Oregonians. The WTDB's mission is to advance Oregon through meaningful work, training and education by empowering people and employers.

The Oregon Workforce and Talent Development Board (WTDB) enables meaningful work for all Oregonians by:

- Leading and communicating a long-term vision for Oregon that anticipates and acts on future workforce needs;
- Advising the Governor and legislature on workforce policy and plans;
- Aligning public workforce policy, resources, and services with employers, education, training and economic development;
- Identifying barriers, providing solutions, and avoiding duplication of services;
- Promoting accountability among public workforce partners; and
- Sharing best practices and innovative solutions that are scalable statewide and across multiple regions.

- Collaborative – We proactively engage all stakeholders as a hub for consensus-building

As a member of WTDB, you will play an important role in helping the Governor assure that public and private investments into workforce development are effective, efficient and responsive to local business and job seeker needs by providing advice and recommending strategic direction. Your role on the WTDB will be to serve as one of many advisors on policy matters to the Governor who is responsible for the management and administration of policy. The WTDB studies existing policy and makes recommendations for change or implementation. Although the WTDB does not have final authority to make or enforce rules, in the areas of board research, strategic direction, and advice to decision makers the WTDB contributes to effective policy and transformational change in state government and Oregon’s workforce system.
