Eligible Youth: A youth eligible to participate in a Reengagement Program, meeting the following criteria: <ul style="list-style-type: none">a. Youth ages 14-21 who are defined as a dropout under ORS 339.505, and not exempt from attending public school under ORS 339.030;b. Youth ages 14-21 who are referred by any of the following: * Oregon Youth Authority * Department of Human Services * Juvenile Court Judges * A County Juvenile Department * A Federally-Recognized Tribe (or agency thereof) * A School District or * An Education Service Districtc. Youth ages 14-21 who are not enrolled in school, and have not earned a high school diploma or GED; ord. Youth ages 16-21 who are enrolled in a public high school, initially enrolled in high school one or more years prior, and have earned 3 or more credits fewer than the expected number of credits to be earned based on the duration of enrollment
Reengagement Partners:
Reengagement Partners: Entities who collaborate to deliver Reengagement Services. Includes school districts, education service districts, non-profit organizations, community based organizations, community colleges, public universities, tribes, counties, cities, local public service agencies and other service providers that cooperate to deliver Reengagement Services as part of the Reengagement Program.
