Mechanical Minor Label – Pilot Program

This pilot program for mechanical minor labels is for contractors holding a valid Construction Contractors Board (CCB) license and who are not in violation of the minor label requirements found in Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 918, Divisions 100 and 440.

HOW to purchase labels:

- Purchase labels online at: <u>buildingpermits.oregon.gov</u>
- Labels are purchased in lots of 10 for \$140.00 (price includes surcharge)
- Labels are then mailed to the contractor

Participating Jurisdictions:

- Albany
- Central Point
- Medford
- Salem
- Coos County
- Deschutes County
- Jackson County
- Linn County
- Marion County
- Umatilla County

Jurisdictions WHERE labels may be used:

- **Coos County** in those areas where the building program is administered by BCD. This includes all of Coos County **EXCEPT** within the city limits of Coos Bay, Lakeside, and North Bend.
- Within areas where **Deschutes County** administers the building inspection program. This includes all of Deschutes County **EXCEPT** within the city limits of Bend and Redmond.
- Within areas where **Jackson County** administers the building inspection program. With Medford and Central Point participating this includes all of Jackson County **EXCEPT** within the city limits of Ashland, Eagle Point, Jacksonville, Phoenix, Rogue River, and Talent.
- Within areas where **Linn County** administers the building inspection program (with Albany participating, this is all areas **EXCEPT** within city limits of Harrisburg, Lebanon, and Sweet Home).
- Within areas where **Marion County** administers the building inspection program (with Salem participating, this is all areas **EXCEPT** within city limits of Aurora, Silverton and Woodburn).
- **Umatilla County** in those areas where the building program is administered by BCD. This includes all of Umatilla County **EXCEPT** for within the city limits of Hermiston, Pendleton, and Umatilla.

Type of work ALLOWED with the minor label:

- Moving or replacing ductwork not involving fire dampers or penetrations of firewalls, fire assemblies or floors
- Relocating grilles and air distribution inlets or outlets
- Replacing existing heating, cooling, and ventilation equipment, including minor alterations of fuel piping or appliance connectors downstream of an appliance shutoff valve
- Adding a central air-conditioning unit to existing ductwork in one and two-family dwellings
- Installing new mini-split heat pumps in one and two-family dwellings
- Installing a mechanical exhaust fan for radon mitigation systems in one and two-family dwellings

Minor labels *CANNOT* be used for:

- Mechanical replacements where the fuel type changes
- Replacement of fuel burning equipment which requires replacement of the existing venting system
- Replacement of commercial systems or equipment that:
 - o Exceeds 2,000 cubic feet per minute of air movement capability
 - Weighs more than 400 pounds, except packaged rooftop equipment up to 5-ton cooling capacity being replaced with packaged rooftop equipment not exceeding the existing unit's cooling capacity
 - Exceeds 5-ton cooling capacity

AFFIX the minor label in one of the following locations:

- On the unit installed
- On the inside of the electrical disconnect box
- On the electrical panel

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- Pictures and/or short videos may be uploaded by the installer at the time the work is done using the free Oregon ePermitting Mobile App.
- BCD staff will randomly select one label from each group of 10 to be inspected by a local inspector.
- If the pictures are adequate, the local inspector will review the uploaded pictures and determine whether the installation has been installed in compliance with the applicable mechanical code.
- If the pictures are not adequate, the local inspector will inspect the installation at the job site.
