Future Ready Oregon Round 3 Grant Awards

Approved by the Oregon State Apprenticeship and Training Council. Awards are listed alphabetically.

Alternative Youth Activities - Coos Bay, Oregon:

Alternative Youth Activities will develop and launch a new construction Pre-Apprenticeship Program focused on the solar photovoltaic industry that will serve 10 high school youth and young adults in the Southwestern Oregon Workforce Investment Board region. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, low-income communities, rural and frontier communities, incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals, members of Oregon's nine federally recognized Indian tribes, Individuals who disproportionately experience discrimination in employment on the basis of age, individuals who identify as members of the LGBTQ+ community. **Award Amount: \$743,000.**

Central Oregon Community College - Bend, Oregon:

Central Oregon Community College will expand their existing construction Pre-Apprenticeship Program to serve 80 youth and young adults by creating a mobile training unit that will travel to rural areas within the East Cascades Works workforce region. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, low-income communities, rural and frontier communities. **Award Amount: \$290,545.**

Chemeketa Community College - Salem, Oregon:

Chemeketa Community College will expand their existing construction Pre-Apprenticeship Program by partnering with identified organizations to serve 55 individuals within the Willamette Workforce Partnership region. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, rural and frontier communities, incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals. **Award Amount: \$297,616.**

Clackamas Workforce Partnership – Clackamas, Oregon:

Clackamas Workforce Partnership will develop and receive BOLI approval for a new Health and Human Services Apprenticeship Program that will serve individuals within the Oregon Workforce Partnership & Clackamas Workforce Partnership workforce regions. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, rural and frontier communities, Incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals, persons with disabilities, individuals who identify as members of the LGBTQ+ community. **Award Amount: \$66,000.**



Crater Lake Joint Apprenticeship & Training Trust Fund – Central Point, Oregon:

Crater Lake Joint Apprenticeship & Training Trust Fund will develop and launch a new construction Pre-Apprenticeship Program that will serve 120 individuals in the Southwestern Oregon Workforce Investment Board and East Cascades Works workforce regions. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, rural and frontier communities, members of Oregon’s nine federally recognized Indian tribes, individuals who identify as members of the LGBTQ+ community. **Award Amount: \$972,150.**

Edvocation – Corvallis, OR:

Edvocation will develop and launch a new wood products focused manufacturing Pre-Apprenticeship Program serving 36 individuals within the Southwestern Oregon Workforce Investment Board region. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, rural and frontier communities, persons with disabilities, members of Oregon’s nine federally recognized Indian tribes, individuals who identify as members of the LGBTQ+ community. **Award Amount: \$312,400.**

Heart of Oregon Corps – Bend, Oregon:

Heart of Oregon Corps will expand their construction Pre-Apprenticeship Program to serve 14 individuals within the Southwestern Oregon Workforce Investment Board region. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Population: women. **Award Amount: \$155,923.74.**

Hillsboro School District – Hillsboro, Oregon:

Hillsboro School District will expand their manufacturing Youth Apprenticeship Program by 10 additional high school students through the purchase of a vehicle that will increase student recruitment and participation by providing current and future youth apprentices with transportation to and from their job/training sites within the WorkSystems, Inc. workforce region. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities; persons with disabilities, individuals who disproportionately experience discrimination in employment based on age, individuals who identify as members of the LGBTQ+ community. **Award Amount: \$115,000.**

Klamath County School District – Klamath Falls, Oregon:

Klamath County School District will develop and launch a new carpentry-focused construction Pre-Apprenticeship Program at Henley High School that will serve 60 students within the East Cascades Works workforce region. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, rural and frontier communities, persons with disabilities. **Award Amount: \$98,190.75**

Lane Education Service District – Eugene, Oregon:

Lane Education Service District will develop and launch a new manufacturing Pre-Apprenticeship Program that will serve 95 high school students within the Lane Workforce Partnership region. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, rural and frontier communities, persons with disabilities, members of Oregon’s nine federally recognized Indian tribes, individuals who identify as members of the LGBTQ+ community. **Award Amount: \$482,856.**

LatinoBuilt Association for Contractors – Portland, Oregon:

LatinoBuilt Association for Contractors will develop and launch a new bilingual construction Pre-Apprenticeship Program that will serve 36 individuals throughout all Oregon workforce regions. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, rural and frontier communities. **Award Amount: \$474,341.20**

Northeast Oregon Area Health Education Center – La Grande, Oregon:

Northeast Oregon Area Health Education Center will develop and receive BOLI approval for a new healthcare Pre-Apprenticeship Program and will recruit 10 high school students within the Eastern Oregon Workforce Board region. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: low-income communities, rural and frontier communities. **Award Amount: \$101,200.**

Pacific NW Ironworkers Apprenticeship 29 – Portland, Oregon:

Pacific NW Ironworkers Apprenticeship 29 will expand their construction Pre-Apprenticeship Program to 72 incarcerated individuals within the Department of Corrections throughout all Oregon workforce regions. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: Communities of color, women, low-income communities, rural and frontier communities, veterans, persons with disabilities, incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals, members of Oregon’s nine federally recognized Indian tribes, individuals who disproportionately experience discrimination on the basis of age, individuals who identify as members of the LGBTQ+ community. **Award Amount: \$ 406,851.23**

Portland Community College – Portland, Oregon:

Portland Community College will expand their construction Pre-Apprenticeship Program to 32 individuals incarcerated in the Columbia River Correctional Institution within the Northwest Oregon Works, WorkSystems, Inc., Clackamas Workforce regions. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals. **Award Amount: \$434,995.**

Portland Community College – Portland, Oregon:

Portland Community College will develop a new semi-conductor focused manufacturing Apprenticeship program that will serve individuals within the Northwest Oregon Works, WorkSystems, Inc., Clackamas Workforce Partnership, Willamette Workforce Partnership regions. Once in operation after the grant period, 15 individuals expected to be served. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals. **Award Amount: \$240,717.**

Portland Opportunities Industrialization Center – Portland, Oregon:

Portland Opportunities Industrialization Center will expand their construction pre-apprenticeship program to Washington County and serve an additional 50 individuals within the WorkSystems, Inc. workforce region. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, low-income communities, incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals. **Award Amount: \$325,000.**

Santiam Hospital & Clinics – Stayton, Oregon:

Santiam Hospital & Clinics will develop and launch a new healthcare related Medical Lab Technician Apprenticeship Program that will serve 15 individuals within WorkSystems, Inc. and the Willamette Workforce Partnership regions. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, rural and frontier communities, persons with disabilities, members of Oregon’s nine federally recognized Indian tribes, individuals who disproportionately experience discrimination in employment on the basis of age, individuals who identify as members of the LGBTQ+ community. **Award Amount: \$ 1,480,480.**

The Urban League of Portland, Inc. – Portland, Oregon:

The Urban League of Portland, Inc. will develop a new electrician focused construction Pre-Apprenticeship Program within the WorkSystems, Inc. workforce region. Once in operation, the program will serve 30 individuals per year. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities. **Award Amount: \$180,719.**

United We Heal Training Trust – Portland, Oregon:

United We Heal Training Trust will expand their healthcare related Certified Alcohol and Drug Counselor Apprenticeship Program to additional Oregon Counties and serve 30 new apprentices within the following workforce regions: Oregon Workforce Partnership, Northwest Oregon Works, WorkSystems, Inc., Clackamas Workforce Partnership, Southwestern Oregon Workforce Investment Board, East Cascades Works regions. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, persons with disabilities, individuals who identify as members of the LGBTQ+ community. **Award Amount: \$326,800.**

West Linn Wilsonville School District – Tualatin, Oregon:

West Linn Wilsonville School District will develop and receive BOLI approval for a new healthcare Pre-Apprenticeship Program for high school youth at Riverside High School in the Clackamas Workforce Partnership region. Once in operation the program will serve 30 students per year. Participant outreach will focus on the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, persons with disabilities, individuals who identify as members of the LGBTQ+ community. **Award Amount: \$180,409.**
