

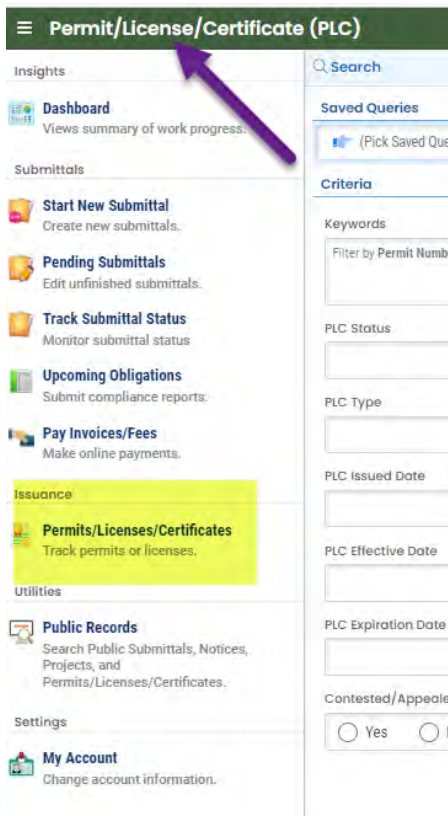


How to View Your Certificate Fact Sheet

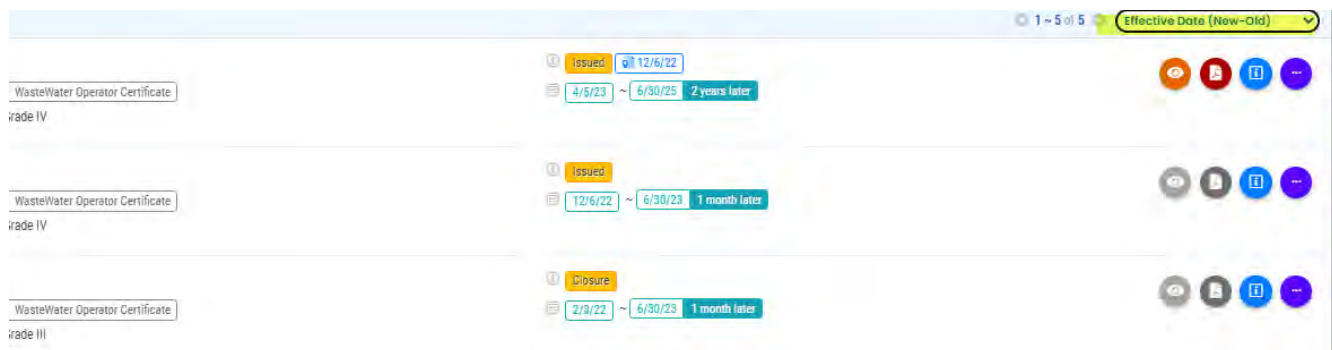
Wastewater System Operator Certification Program

The Permit / License / Certificate Fact Sheet replaces the traditional certificate “validation card” format. Use the steps outlined below to view your certificate validation fact sheet.

Step 1: Access your YDO account, and open the Permits/Licenses/Certificates module.



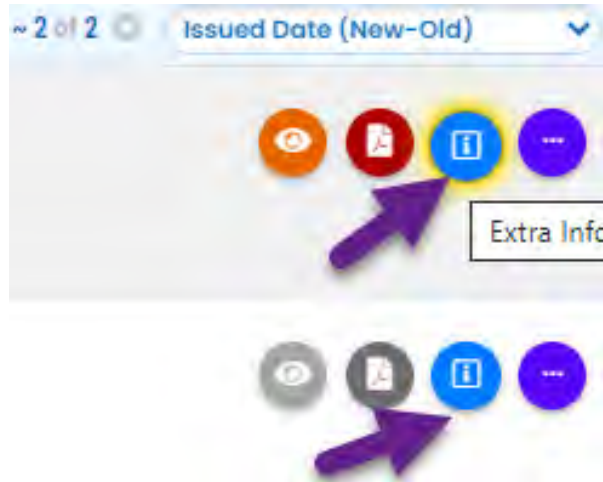
This will display the list of your certificate(s); see screenshot below. You can change the sort order in the drop-down box in the upper right:
