NOTE: This survey was made by Philo H. Anderson assisted by H. F. Swain, R. E. Barton and W. C. Pierce, instruments 281, E. Cooke light mountain transit and a 500 ft. steel tape. Bearings are true as determined by Polaris observations at 5:40 A.M. Elevations determined by spirit of angles and based on assumed datum of 4700 feet. The survey consists of open traverses and is therefore unlinked, and probably is in error to a degree that can be determined only by running additional lines to close the traverses. The West 2000 ft. of Coulter Tunnel was run under adverse conditions due to blasting which cut visibility and part of surface lines were surveyed in fog and rain. It is therefore here by stated that this survey is approximately correct only and it is to be used only on that basis until properly checked and balanced. In order to facilitate comparison with other surveys the third or number of some is indicated wherever applicable. Other surveys coincide with stations of this survey. Sections shown were never run on the ground but were projected into this map by Great Field notes. Beginning of the Pa. Cor. between sections 27 & 34, T. 6 S. R. 45 W. Oregon, was not run to avoid access but was continued, due to conditions under which made and fact that the traverses are even and unlinked the undersigned will certify that the points indicated here are approximate only.
