Consolidated Permit Application Submitted

On November 15, 2019, Calico Resources USA Corporation (Calico) filed a <u>Consolidated Permit Application</u> under Oregon's chemical process mining laws and regulations. Calico is proposing to construct an underground gold mine, surface mill complex, and tailings storage facility at Grassy Mountain, about 22 miles south-southeast of Vale in Malheur County. The site includes both private and public lands managed by the US Bureau of Land Management (BLM).

A <u>Notice of Intent</u> was filed February 28, 2017 and the <u>Environmental Baseline Study Work Plans</u> were finalized on September 22, 2017. Baseline data collection and review remains ongoing.

Under Oregon law (ORS 517.952 – 517.989), a consolidated application process is used for administering state regulatory requirements for chemical process mines. The majority of the requirements are consolidated into a permit issued by the Oregon Department of Geology and Mineral Industries (DOGAMI). The proposed Grassy Mountain Gold Project is located in Malheur County, Oregon located approximately 22 miles south-southwest of Vale, Oregon. Calico is proposing to construct an underground mine, surface mill complex, and tailings storage facility to develop the Grassy Mountain gold resource. The Mine and Process Area is located on three (3) patented lode mining claims and unpatented lode and mill site claims, all on public land managed by BLM. The access road area is located on both BLM-managed and private land controlled by others. A majority of the access is via Malheur County road Twin Springs Road; the road extends north from the Mine and Process Area to paved county road Russell Road.

Calico has filed a <u>Consolidated Permit Application</u> under ORS 517 and OAR 632 Division 37. In accordance with Oregon regulations, DOGAMI will provide copies of the application to affected governments and agencies. When all members of the Technical Review Team concur that the permitting and cooperating agencies are ready to being preparing draft permits, DOGAMI shall conduct a public hearing and accept written comments. Notice of the public hearing and comment period shall be provided when the date, location, and period allowed for written comment has been established by DOGAMI.
