

PASSPORT COMPONENTS

Learning Outcomes (PLOs) Statement of what a student must know and/or be able to do to attain Lowerdivision General Education proficiency.

✓ e.g., "Listen and critically...evaluate the speaker's central message...and use supporting materials."

Proficiency Criteria (PCs)

Statement of an assignment currently used for students to show transfer-level proficiency with the PLO.

e.g., "Complete appropriate, constructive peer evaluations; prepare a summary of a speech's main points...."
