9:10	<p>Pesticide Stewardship Partnership – Next Biennium</p> <p>The Oregon Department of Agriculture has proposed a 10% cut in the ODA budget for the next fiscal year. As a major part of this proposed cut ODA has proposed eliminating the current PSP position.</p> <p>A status update will be presented and the WQPMT will have a discussion of “what ifs” for the upcoming fiscal year. Item to consider are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What does this mean for PSP activities?</li> <li>• What does this mean for partners?</li> <li>• What does this mean for the current MOU regarding PSP?</li> </ul> <p>The purpose of this discussion will be to develop several fallback positions depending of the Governor’s Budget and then finally the Legislature final budget</p>
9:50	<p>Presentation and Review of Newly Issued Reports</p> <p>Since our last meeting several reports have been finalized. These include the 2017-19 Biennial Report, the accompanying fact sheet, the South Umpqua Report, and the Pesticide of High, Moderate, concern Report. An overview of these reports will be presented to members of the WQPMT.</p>
10:30	<p>Discussion Item: Using Information from Other Agency Pesticide Programs to Inform PSP Outreach and Monitoring</p> <p>To better focus outreach and technical assistance, as well as reconnaissance monitoring, should the PSP use information and data from other programs operated by WQPMT member agencies or PARC? This could include environmental complaint and pesticide use information generated from compliance program. The intent would be to better refine geographic outreach and monitoring, rather than focus on individual landowners.</p>
11:15	<p>changes in EPA’s Cooperative Agreement</p> <p>Beginning in 2021 the Water Quality Cooperative Agreement will be modified. This is the agreement that requires the designation of Pesticides of High and Moderate Concern, implementation of management measures, and reporting to EPA on progress. Several key elements of this agreement will change including the list of Pesticides on Interest, how we report data to EPA, and whether we continue to upload PSP data to EPA. The WQPMT will be briefed on these changes and a proposal will be made as to how we will determine Oregon’s Pesticides of Interest.</p>
