What to Do if You Fail a Pesticide Test

Retest the failed sample

Within seven (7) days, send the same laboratory that did the initial test a request for reanalysis.

If the sample passes:

- Within seven (7) days, request a second accredited laboratory to resample the batch and confirm the passed test result.

If the sample fails:

- The batch of the hemp item(s) must be destroyed in a manner specified by ODA.

Notify the Hemp Program within seven (7) days after you receive a failed test result if you want to retest or resample. If we do not receive any notification, we will send you information about the destruction process.

Remediate Usable Hemp

If a sample from a batch of usable hemp fails pesticide testing for piperonyl butoxide or pyrethrins, ODA may permit remediation.

Verify

- Contact the Hemp Program to see if you qualify for remediation of usable hemp.

Remediate Extracts & Concentrates

Only if a handler is processing a cannabinoid concentrate or extract with hemp flower or biomass that was tested in no more than 30-pound batches.

Provide Notice

- Provide notice to the Hemp Program of the intent to remediate.
- You must also provide the test results showing the hemp flower or biomass was tested in no more than 30-pound batches.

A batch that is remediated must be resampled and retested.
