My public comment for the December 11-12th Board meeting:

My hope is that you will continue to seek ways to pay for Oregon high school students to study abroad. For 2012-13, Report #51 of the Oregon Department Of Education shows a statewide annual "Operating Expenditures per Student" of \$9,364. Below, as an example, are the fees for ASSE study abroad programs. Note that school year study abroad programs to thirty different countries each cost less than the annual operating expenditures per student in Oregon.

ASSE was established in 1976 as the American Scandinavian Student Exchange by the Swedish Government to organize student exchange programs between Sweden and the United States. Soon Denmark, Norway and Finland elected to participate.

At present, ASSE works closely with the Canadian provincial education ministries and is approved by the Ministry of Education in New Zealand. ASSE maintains 38 offices in 31 countries and accommodates more than 30,000 high school age students and host families annually in its programs in the participating countries

Oregon should find a way to pay for these study abroad programs for Oregon high school students.
