## Summary of 2017-18 Four-year and Five-year Cohort Graduation and Completer Rates January 24, 2019

The four-year cohort graduation rate follows students from the beginning of their first year in high school to the end of their fourth year in high school in order to determine the percentage of those students who graduate within four years.

This year's <u>four-year cohort</u> is made up of the students who first entered high school in 2014-15. The original set of students who enter Oregon high schools for the first time in 2014-15 is adjusted for students who transfer into the Oregon public school system, transfer out to private or home school, leave the state or country, or are deceased. The cohort graduation rate is calculated by taking the number of students in the adjusted cohort who earned a standard diploma within four years and dividing that by the total number of students in the adjusted cohort. See the tables below for the cohort rates for all students and for various student groups.

In January 2018 ODE <u>reported</u> the four-year graduation rate for the students who first entered high school in 2013-14. The four-year cohort graduation rate followed those students from the fall of 2013 through the summer of 2017. This year, ODE followed the same cohort of students for an additional year in order to determine the *five-year* graduation rate for that cohort.

ODE also reports a cohort completer rate along with the cohort graduation rates. This rate includes students who earned a standard high school diploma, as well as those who were awarded an extended high school diploma, adult high school diploma, or GED (known as Other Completers), within the four or five years being measured.

Note that students who did not earn a diploma or other completion credential are not necessarily dropouts. This category includes students who are continuing for an additional year of enrollment, as well as students who earned an alternative certificate.

Beginning in 2016-17, rules regarding the participation of students in fifth-year programs were changed, and the Post Graduate Scholars program was created. This significantly reduced the number of students who earned an Oregon Diploma that was not awarded, most of whom are predicted to have been awarded their diploma and continued into a Post Graduate Scholars program or college enrollment. For the 2016-17 and 2017-18 rates, no students earned a diploma that has not been awarded, so this category has been removed from the tables below.
