## Summary of 2012-13 Four-year and Five-year Cohort Graduation and Completer Rates

The four-year cohort graduation rate follows students from the fall of their first year in high school to the end of their fourth year in high school in order to determine the percentage of those students who graduate within four years.

This year's four-year cohort is made up of the students who first entered high school in 2009-10. The original set of students who enter Oregon high schools for the first time in 2009-10 is adjusted for students who transfer into the Oregon public school system, transfer out to private or home school, leave the state or country, or are deceased. The cohort graduation rate is calculated by taking the number of students in the adjusted cohort who graduated with a regular diploma within four years and dividing that by the total number of students in the adjusted cohort. See the tables below for the cohort rates for all students and for various subgroups.

In January 2013 ODE <u>reported</u> the four-year graduation rate for the students who first entered high school in 2008-09. The four-year cohort graduation rate followed those students from the fall of 2008 through the summer of 2012. This year, ODE followed the same cohort of students for an additional year in order to determine the *five-year* graduation rate for that cohort.

Beginning with the 2011-12 rates, ODE also reported a cohort completer rate. This rate includes students who were awarded a regular high school diploma, as well as those who were awarded a modified high school diploma, extended high school diploma, adult high school diploma, or GED, within the four or five years being measured.
