ANNUAL MEASURABLE OBJECTIVES (AMOS) For 2012-13 through 2017-18

WHAT ARE ANNUAL MEASURABLE OBJECTIVES

Annual Measurable Objectives (AMOs) are targets set for student achievement in the subjects of reading and math, as well as for graduation, attendance and participation. Oregon's ESEA Flexibility Waiver revised the AMOs for reading and math and also changed the way these AMOs are used in school accountability. School and district Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) will no longer be reported. Instead, the new Oregon Report Card will provide a 5-level rating for each school. The overall rating for a school is a combination of the ratings received in each of the following five indicators:

- Achievement
- Growth
- Subgroup Growth
- Graduation (high schools only)
- Subgroup Graduation (high schools only)

AMO targets are incorporated into the Achievement, Graduation, and Subgroup Graduation ratings, as described below.

AMOs FOR READING AND MATHEMATICS

Schools meeting the targets below will receive a Level 4 or Level 5 rating in Achievement on the new Report Card.
