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Student Achievement

To meet each student achievement requirement, the student group must meet the statewide academic target; or reduce the percentage of tests not meeting standards by 10% and meet the state target for attendance.

Graduation

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Federal Adequate Yearly Progress Rating

The No Child Left Behind Act requires the annual determination of whether schools, districts, and the state have made adequate yearly progress (AYP) toward the goal of having all students meet rigorous state academic standards by the 2013-2014 school year. Each year, the performance of all students in the school and district, as well as subgroups of students, is measured against annual performance targets.

If all groups meet the targets in English/Language Arts and Mathematics, and the school meets the target for attendance, the school is designated as Meeting AYP. If any target is not met, then the school is designated as Not Meeting AYP.

A school or district that does not meet AYP should not be labeled as failing. 


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
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
Academic Achievement Percentage of Students Meeting Standards

Percentage of Students Meeting Standards

The bar charts show the percentage of students in the school at the indicated grades that met or exceeded state standards on the 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 Oregon Statewide Assessments in Reading, Math, and Science Knowledge and Skills. Mathematics achievement standard were revised for 2010-2011. To aid in year-to-year comparisons, the 2010-2011 math results are displayed using both the 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 standards. Displays are also shown for three other groups: comparison schools, district, and state. Comparison schools have similar percentages of students eligible for free and reduced price meals, students moving in and out of school during the year, English Language Learners, and similar attendance rates.
