performance targets.
If all groups meet the targets in English/Language
Arts and Mathematics, and the school meets the Artr and for attendance, the school is designated as
target Meeting AYP. If any target is not met, the
school is designated as Did Not Meet AYP. school is designated as Did Not Meet AYP. A school or district that does not meet AYP should
not be labeled as filing. The description of no meeting AY signals that the shchool or idisticict as
