# Farm to School Grant Updates

## **Competitive Procurement Grant**

Applications for the Competitive Procurement Grant are now available on the [Farm to School Grant webpage](#).

### **What is the Competitive Procurement Grant?**

The Competitive Procurement Grant is part of the Farm to School Program and is intended to provide eligible Farm to School grantees with additional funding above their original Farm to School award amount. These funds are derived from a reallocation process in which the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) redistributes unspent Farm to School award dollars from grantees that have determined they are unable to exhaust their original awards.

To be eligible for these funds, applicants must be either a School District, a provider of center-based programs for children in the Child and Adult Care Food Program, or be an entity that provides meals through the Summer Food Service Program. In addition, applicants must have been awarded a Farm to School Noncompetitive Procurement Grant and 1) have spent all of the Noncompetitive funds, **or** 2) have a zero balance (due to the legislative reduction process).

The intent of the Farm to School Noncompetitive Procurement Grant has always been to support grantee purchasing of Oregon grown and processed food that might otherwise be cost prohibitive. To ensure grant funds are spent within the intent of the grant, the Farm to School team has designed the grant application process as follows:

1) Complete and submit the Competitive Procurement Grant RFA. Every applicant is guaranteed a base award amount (depending on availability of funds), that can be spent on any allowable Oregon grown or processed foods, as with the Noncompetitive Procurement grant.

2) Applicants can be awarded MORE funding by filling out the RFA and achieving preference points. Preference points are given for purchasing plans that include categories such as: purchasing from minority or women-owned companies, serving culturally relevant foods, purchasing a variety of Oregon products or purchasing new Oregon products and developing new commercial relationships. The higher the applicant's preference point score, the higher the additional funding (see RFA for preference point matrix).

## Farm to School Spotlight:

### Competitive Procurement Grant Round 1

We are pleased to announce that the first round of competitive procurement grants have been awarded. Awards went to 22 applicants totaling close to \$350,000. Grantees listed 40 Oregon small farms and businesses that they will be working with over the remainder of the biennium. Awards were granted to:

Some highlights include:

**Bend LaPine SD** plans to purchase Yakisoba noodles from Umi noodles, an all women-owned business. The school district also plans to purchase half carcasses of pork from Home Farm Foods, an Animal Welfare Approved business, that culinary students will butcher and smoke with Chef guidance.

**Neverland Nursery School** in Springfield, OR plans to participate in a local meat CSA through UBA Ranch LLC and to purchase vegetables from Winter Green Farm in Noti, OR.

**Port Orford-Langlois SD** plans to purchase local seafood from Port Orford Sustainable Seafood, as well as local beef from Oregon Grass Fed Beef and local produce from Valley Flora, a woman-owned small farm in Langlois.

**Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital** plans to purchase fresh produce at the Newport Farmers Market from Pablo Munoz Farms, Neal Farm, and Gathering Together Farm as well as from Corvus Landing Farm.

**Willamina SD** is working with Mama Tee's, a woman-owned local farm, that provides farm-grown vegetables, berries and eggs.

### Questions About Farm to School?

Oregon's Farm to School and School Garden [\*Resource People document\*](#) has been updated. Here you will find contact information for people who can answer specific questions about different Farm to School topics.
