#### **Chickens and Eggs in School Gardens**

Have you ever considered raising chickens in your school garden? Currently, we show that at least 35 schools in Oregon have school gardens that raise chickens. Many ask the question, "Can I sell our eggs to the public?" (this is pretty easy, actually) and "Can I use our eggs in the cafeteria?" We are pleased to announce that the 2021-2023 Competitive Reimbursement Grant is now open! Applicants must have been awarded a Farm to CNP Non-Competitive Reimbursement Grant and have a \$0 balance of Non-Competitive funds.

The timeline for Round three of the Competitive Reimbursement Grant is as follows:

- Questions/Requests for Clarification are due September 1, 2022 by
   10AM
- Applications are due September 8, 2022 by 2PM.

There will be a total of six rounds of the Competitive Reimbursement Grant through the end of the biennium.

## Noncompetitive Reimbursement Grant

- The Farm to CNP Reimbursement Grant is now listed under "The Office of the Director" in ODE's Electronic Grants Management System (EGMS). This is where you will find your 2021-2023 biennium awards.
- The 2021-2023 claim form can be found on the <u>Farm to CNP</u> <u>Reimbursement Grant webpage</u>. It is the first item under the "Resources for Claims" section.
- The mandatory Training Webinar is now available on the
   <u>Reimbursement Grant webpage</u>. This is a recorded webinar.
   Please view as your schedule allows. After viewing is complete, each grantee must fill out a <u>Reimbursement Grant Attestation Form</u>.
- Before Farm to CNP claims can be approved, returning sponsors must complete a <u>Final Report</u> from last biennium and new sponsors must complete a <u>Baseline Report</u>.

# SY 2022-2023 FFVP Applications Now Open!

Applications for FFVP SY 2022-2023 can be found on the **FFVP webpage**. These funds will cover any FFVP costs your participating schools incur between October 1, 2022 and September 30, 2023.

If you currently have a school that participated in SY 2021-2022 and it is still over 50% free and reduced, no action is necessary for those particular schools as they will automatically be re-enrolled.

Some helpful points to remember if you are interested in applying for the FFVP grant:

- The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) administers the FFVP at the Federal level.
- The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) administers the FFVP at the State level.
- FFVP sub-grants are awarded to schools, not school districts.
- Only elementary schools (defined as K-8) are eligible.
- Awards are granted to those schools representing the highest percentage of students certified for free & reduced price benefits.
- Only schools participating in the NSLP are eligible.

We will be accepting applications for SY 2022-2023 until **September 1, 2022**.

Applications will be reviewed and turned around quickly after this date. An application does not guarantee an award, as we will prioritize schools with the highest need based on F&R%. If you would like a list of free and reduced percentages for schools in your district that are not currently enrolled in the FFVP please let me know.

#### Civil Rights and Complaints Process

In accordance with Federal civil rights law and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) civil rights regulations and policies, the USDA, its Agencies, offices, and employees, and institutions participating in or administering USDA programs are prohibited from discriminating based on race, color, national origin, sex, disability, age, or reprisal or retaliation for prior civil rights activity in any program or activity conducted or funded by USDA.

Persons with disabilities who require alternative means of communication for program information (e.g. Braille, large print, audiotape, American Sign Language, etc.), should contact the Agency (State or local) where they applied for benefits. Individuals who are deaf, hard of hearing or have speech disabilities may contact USDA through the Federal Relay Service at (800) 877-8339. Additionally, program information may be made available in languages other than English.
