#### PROCLAMATION

OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS: Farm to School enriches community connections with nourishing food and local producers by changing

food purchasing and education practices at schools and preschools, providing local food to children, and providing educational experiences including farm field trips, cooking lessons, and school garden activities;

and

WHEREAS: Farm to School and school garden programs support students' access to healthy, local foods and have been

shown to increase children's participation in school meal programs and consumption of fruits and vegetables, thereby improving childhood nutrition and preventing obesity and obesity-related diseases; and

WHEREAS: Oregon has a \$10.2 million Farm to School grant program and 784 established school gardens that improve

children's knowledge about, and attitudes toward, agriculture, food, nutrition, and the environment. Farmto-school programs have been shown to result in increased market opportunities for farmers, fishers, ranchers, food processors, and food manufacturers and to support economic development; and

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WHEREAS: Racial and ethnic disparities exist in our food system, both in terms of access to healthy food and income from producing food, inextricably linking food justice to racial justice; Oregon's Farm to School efforts involve state agencies, community partners, academia, producers, and child nutrition programs working

together to lift up children, families, and communities in an equitable and inclusive way; and

WHEREAS: Oregon's local farmers, farm workers, and school nutrition professionals are key components of our state's

vibrant food system; during this month we should show our support and appreciation for our local food and

farming heroes and celebrate Farm to School Month in Oregon.

NOW,

THEREFORE: I, Kate Brown, Governor of the State of Oregon, hereby proclaim October 2022 to be

#### Farm to School Month

in Oregon and encourage all Oregonians to join in this observance.

## Announcing the 2022-2023 Oregon School Garden Survey!

Currently Oregon has 788 school gardens! That's over half the schools in Oregon.

We last did an extensive survey starting in 2017. We spent the past couple years getting feedback of what we are missing and adding or changing the questions we had. We are ready to send out the survey, and like everything else, we had to pause while COVID ran its course, as many gardens were inactive

We now have 44 questions; it should take 15-20 minutes to complete a survey for each garden. We ask that everyone should fill out a new survey for this, even if you have filed one out in the past. It's important to fill out the survey even if your garden is in hiatus or information while our evaluation team and Oregon Farm to School & School Garden Network continue to shape out future in school gardens

# CNP Grant Updates

# **Noncompetitive Reimbursement Grant**

- The Farm to CNP Reimbursement Grant is now listed under "The Office of the Director" in ODE's Electronic Grants Management System (EGMS). This is where you will find your 2021-2023 biennium awards.
- The Progress Reports for the non-competitive reimbursement grant are past due. You can link directly to the <u>progress report</u> or access it through the <u>Farm to CNP Reimbursement Grant web page</u>. This progress report is mandatory and required of all sponsors that participate in the ODE Farm to CNP Reimbursement Grant. You will not be able to submit future reimbursement claims or receive additional funding until this report is submitted.
- The 2021-2023 claim form can be found on the <u>Farm to CNP</u> <u>Reimbursement Grant webpage</u>. It is the first item under the "Resources for Claims" section.
- The mandatory Training Webinar is now available on the
   <u>Reimbursement Grant webpage</u>. This is a recorded webinar. Please
   view as your schedule allows. After viewing is complete, each grantee
   must fill out a <u>Reimbursement Grant Attestation Form</u>.
- Before Farm to CNP claims can be approved, returning sponsors must complete a <u>Final Report</u> from last biennium and new sponsors must complete a <u>Baseline Report</u>.

# Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP)

- Please continue to submit claims to FarmtoCNP@ode.oregon.gov according to the SY 2021-2022 FFVP timeline. August 2022 claims are due Sunday, October 30, 2022.
- October begins FFVP SY 22-23. Claims beginning October 1, will be a part of this school year.
- The mandatory annual FFVP training will be announced soon. This training will need to be completed before submitting your first claim for the 22-23 school year.

Awardees will be notified of their application status soon. Successful awardees must spend all of their funds by June 30, 2023. We are unable to approve any extensions.

# Oregon Harvest for Schools

The Oregon Department of Education's Child Nutrition Program and OSU Extension's Food Hero campaign teamed up to launch the <u>Oregon Harvest for Schools video series</u> which currently includes a total of 47 videos.

#### **Civil Rights and Complaints Process**

In accordance with Federal civil rights law and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) civil rights regulations and policies, the USDA, its Agencies, offices, and employees, and institutions participating in or administering USDA programs are prohibited from discriminating based on race, color, national origin, sex, disability, age, or reprisal or retaliation for prior civil rights activity in any program or activity conducted or funded by USDA.
