



Chronic Absenteeism

- We define a student as chronically absent if they are absent (for any reason) for more than 10% of their enrolled days.
- Chart on the next page includes all students enrolled on May 1 with at least 75 days of enrollment in the district.

Percentage of Students Chronically Absent from School, 2014-15









RACE/ETHNICITY OF STUDENTS AND STAFF 2014-15





Teacher Retention


- The graph shows subsequent employment of new teachers in 2011-12.
- Date is in the 2015 Oregon Educator Equity Report.
- Due to small counts, Hispanic, African American,
 Native American, and Pacific Islander were combined.
- New racially diverse teachers were slightly more likely to be remain employed and to remain employed as teachers.
- Title I (high poverty) schools were slightly more likely to employ racially diverse teachers.


Figure 16: New Teachers in 2011-12, by Subsequent Year Employment and Race/Ethnicity


74 new racially diverse teachers hired in 2011-12 Hispanic/Latino (N=29). In this cohort, teachers of color (although still a very small group) were more likely than teachers as a whole to remain employed, and to remain employed as teachers.




























High School Graduation Rates by District and Ethnicity Cohort Media File




