
Sir :-

Replying to yours of Aug. 12th marked "Education, 34,412, 34,841, 41,261" with enclosures from Agent Applegate and Rev. Jesse Kirk in regard to the transfer of Mr. Kirk's two sons from this school to Phoenix, I have to respectfully advise you that Mr. Kirk's son Clayton was sent home Mar. 9th, traveling with his father who was returning from Washington. Selden remained here, but I am entirely satisfied to let him go to Phoenix, and if you will give the order I will forward him at once and pay the expense from my Carlisle appropriation.

The whole party made up by Rev. Jesse Kirk, with the exception of one boy, has proved to be the most unsatisfactory of any party received at the school in recent years. The Kirk boys were the worst of the lot. We are getting the one, Selden, who remains here, into some shape now, and his transfer to Phoenix will probably be something of a disaster to him, but we shall be glad to spare him.

Sir:

I would respectfully call your attention to a conversation I had with you while I was in Washington last March, in regard to my two sons, who were, at that time, pupils in the Carlisle Indian School.

At that time you excused my eldest son, Clayton, on account of ill health, and stated that you would have my youngest son, Seldon Kirk, transferred to any other school that I might choose, during the coming vacation.

As I have concluded to have my two sons attend the school at Phoenix, Arizona, I respectfully request that my son Seldon, at present at Carlisle, be sent home after the expiration of the present school year, to spend his vacation here.

At the expiration of the coming vacation I will send both my sons to Phoenix and think there may be a few other children here who will be willing to go with them.

My reason for wishing to have my children sent to Phoenix is on account of the fact that the climate at that place is more nearly

like that of this, being very dry and that the children of this reservation would enjoy better health there than at any other place, as the Klamath Indians are predisposed to consumption and cannot stand the change to a moist location.

I am doing all I can to have a class sent to Phoenix this fall. I would respectfully request that the cost of transferring my son to this place be defrayed by the Carlisle School, but if this cannot be done I would request that the money be advanced for the purpose and I will deposit the amount needed with the Agent to be used to reimburse the Department.


