**National Wildfire Coordination Group:** The line, area, or zone where structures and other human development meet or intermingle with undeveloped wildland or vegetation fuels.

**Ready Set Go:** An area or zone where human development meets or mixes with natural vegetation.

**OR SB 360:** A geographic area of forestland inside a forest protection district where there exists a concentration of structures in an urban or suburban setting.

Federal Register: The area where houses meet or intermingle with undeveloped wildland vegetation.

Below are WUI definitions used in some other western states. These are all the same as or similar to the International WUI definition and the US Forest Service/Federal Register definition. The WUI definition and designation is straight-forward; variations are in what follows from it: the type of voluntary programs, regulatory structures, preventative actions, public health interventions, and/or other actions that are taken and the scale at which they are applied (local, regional, state). As in these states, these other actions that will be addressed at later points in the SB 762 implementation process, after the WUI is designated. In addition, many, if not all, these states make use of federal grants and other programs that are also based on the Federal Register definition.<sup>1</sup>

### H. Erica Fischer (OSU) WUI Definition Feedback (She is unable to attend the 8/10/21 Meeting)

I would tend to agree with the International WUI code definition or the definition used by the state of WA as provided by Mary Kyle McCurdy. I also wonder what the implications are of us not having the same definition as the International WUI code or our neighboring states. Are there implications with firefighting or insurance? Is there land that straddles both OR and WA that would be considered WUI in one state and not WUI in the other?

Excluding the world "intermingles" from the definition could exclude certain types of communities, particularly intermix communities. The WUI is a very complex landscape and most complex when the wildland is intermixed with the built environment as the fire doesn't shift from a wildland fire to an only urban fire. Excluding this part of the definition may imply that WUIs only exist when the two landscapes are next to each other, but separate.

There is currently a significant risk of WUI fires in Oregon in our farming communities. I would also support the use of "wildland vegetative fuels" or "wildland or vegetative fuels" to include this type of fuel loading. I am not sure if the current survey results would exclude this type of landscape. This phrasing also enforces that the WUI definition is the mix of vegetative fuels with the built environment fuels.
