9/16/2021	Process: Updated Workplan and Meeting Pace Substantive Discussion: Oregon Explorer	1.	 At what interval should the Oregon Explorer be updated? Updated Recommendation (based on September 16 meeting): The Department recommends that OSU updates the Oregon Explorer and other web-based tools for SB762 within 12 months, but no sooner than 9 months, after updates to the most current wildfire risk assessment.
9/30/2021	Wildfire Risk Calculation and Definitions	2.	 How should wildfire risk be calculated? Recommendation: The Department recommends that wildfire risk be calculated as a combined value of how often wildfires occur and intensity of such wildfires. How should "vegetative fuels" be defined? Recommendation: The Department recommends defining "vegetative fuels" as "any land or clearing that, during any time of the year, contains enough plant growth or slash to constitute a fire hazard, regardless of how the land is zoned or taxed."
		4.	 How should "wildland fuels" be defined?" Recommendation: The Department recommends defining "wildland fuels" as "grasslands, brushlands, woodlands, timberlands, or wilderness."

		6.	 At what level should fuel loading be measured? Recommendation: The Department recommends that fuel loading be measured when "fire season" occurs.
		7.	 Should interim disturbances (large wildfires) be considered? Recommendation: The Department recommends that large disturbances that occur between wildfire risk assessments be captured in the subsequent wildfire risk assessment update.
10/28/2021	Definitions	8.	 How should "geographic area" be defined? Recommendation: The Department recommends defining "geographic area" as "an area of land that can be considered as a unit for the purposes of some classification."
		9.	 How should "structures" be defined? Recommendation: The Department recommends defining "structures" as "a permanently sited building on a tax lot that is used as a home, residence, or sleeping place by one or more people.
		10	. How should "other human development" be defined?
			• Recommendation: The Department recommends defining "other human development" as "fundamental facilities, communication, energy and transportation that supports a populated area."

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		 11. Additionally, should the department consider future growth, including planned undeveloped urban growth boundaries, as within the WUI boundary? Recommendation: The Department recommends including areas designated in five-year plans be included in the WUI boundary.

Recommendation: ODF recommends adopting the national standard of one structure per 40-acre block. 13. How should the Department define "Meets" and "Intermingles?" Recommendation: The Department recommends the following recommendations, which are consistent with the regional and federal guidelines, as follows. a. "Meets" (interface) one structure/40 acre with >50% wildland/vegetative fuels. b. "Intermingles" (Intermix) one structure/40 acre with a 2.4 km buffer into the community from and area with >75% wildland/vegetative fuels.
