Health Information Network

Defined in the ONC 21st Century Cures Act final rule at https://www.federalregister.gov/d/2020-07419/p-1775

"A health information network or health information exchange means an individual or entity that determines, controls, or has the discretion to administer any requirement, policy, or agreement that permits, enables, or requires the use of any technology or services for access, exchange, or use of EHI: (1) Among more than two unaffiliated individuals or entities (other than the individual or entity to which this definition might apply) that are enabled to exchange with each other; and (2) that is for a treatment, payment, or health care operations purpose"

Three tests for being an HIN...

What? Determines, controls, or has the discretion to administer any requirement, policy, or agreement that permits, enables, or requires use of any technology or services for access, exchange, or use of EHI

□ Who? Among more than two unaffiliated individuals or entities (other than the individual or entity that might be the HIN)

□ Why? For a treatment, payment, or health care operations

Patient Access API

<u>Which rule</u>: CMS Interop and Patient Access

- <u>What data</u>: claims, encounters, clinical data maintained and in the USCDI
- Applies to: CMS-regulated entities (all of which are payers)
- Share with: Patients
- Share via: Patient app using FHIR
- Starting: 1 July 2021

Information Blocking

<u>Which rule</u>: ONC 21st Century Cures Act

- What data: EHI, initially the USCDI but expanding over time
- Applies to: HIT developers, health care providers, HINs
- **Share with:** Patients, providers, and payers
- Share via: Unspecified
- Starting: 5 April 2021
