The CLAS standards are:

- 1. Commit to high quality language support.
- 2. Promote CLAS with policy, practices, and resources.
- 3. Recruit leaders and staff carefully.
- 4. Train leaders and staff on CLAS.
- 5. Offer language support to users.
- 6. Tell those you serve that language aid is offered.
- 7. Make sure staff have skills in providing language support.
- 8. Provide materials for those that you serve in the language they use.
- 9. Form goals in your work around the needs of those you serve.
- 10. Assess progress of the goals you have set.
- 11. Collect data about who you are serving.
- 12. Find out community needs.
- 13. Bring in the people that you serve to help you serve them.
- 14. Solve barriers to the community's needs.
- 15. Share growth with the community.
