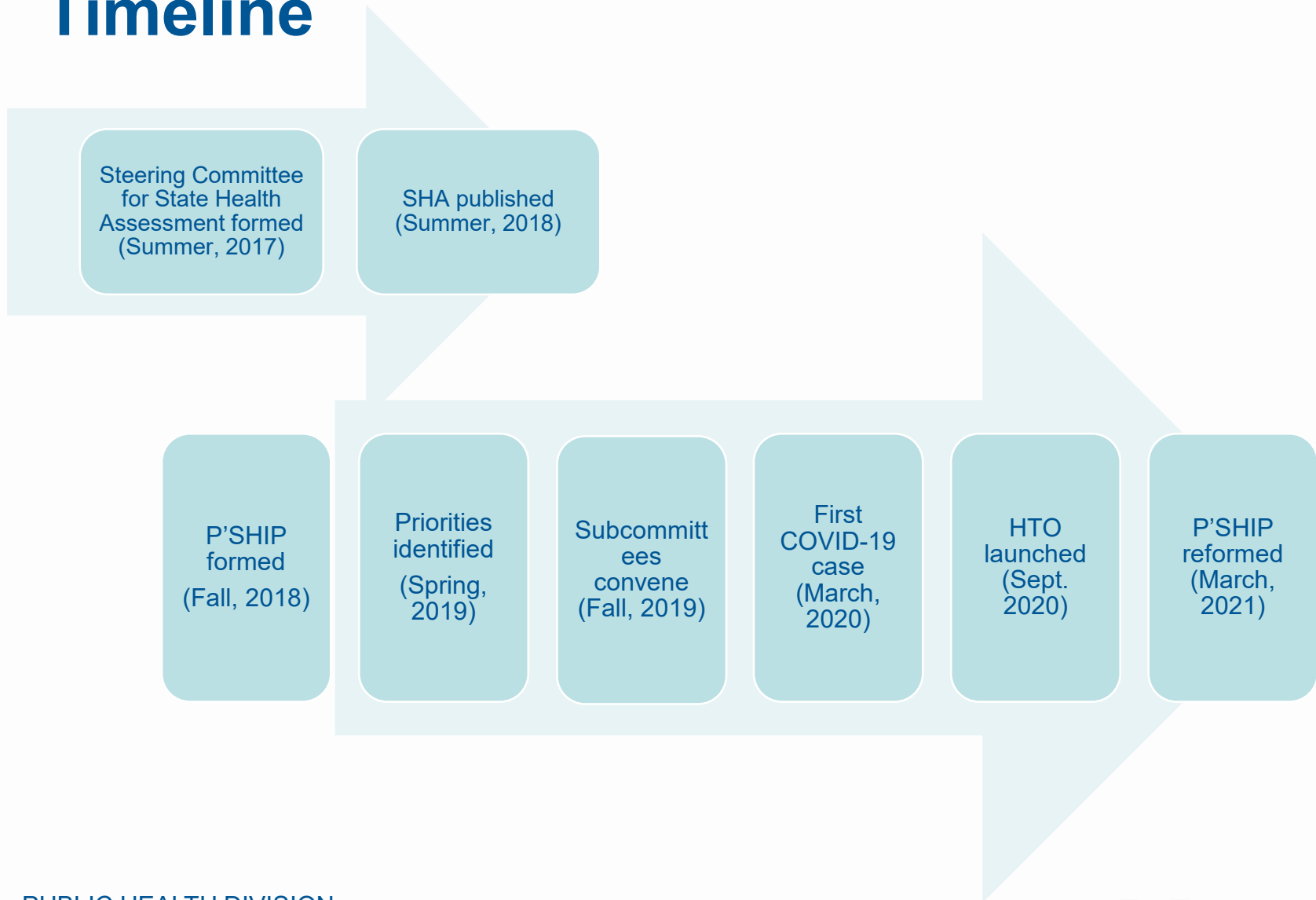

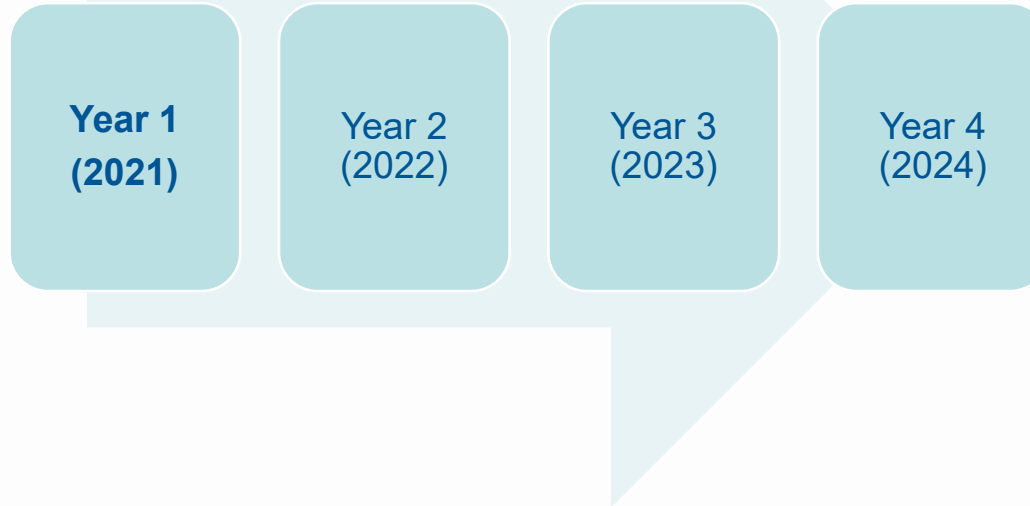
Timeline

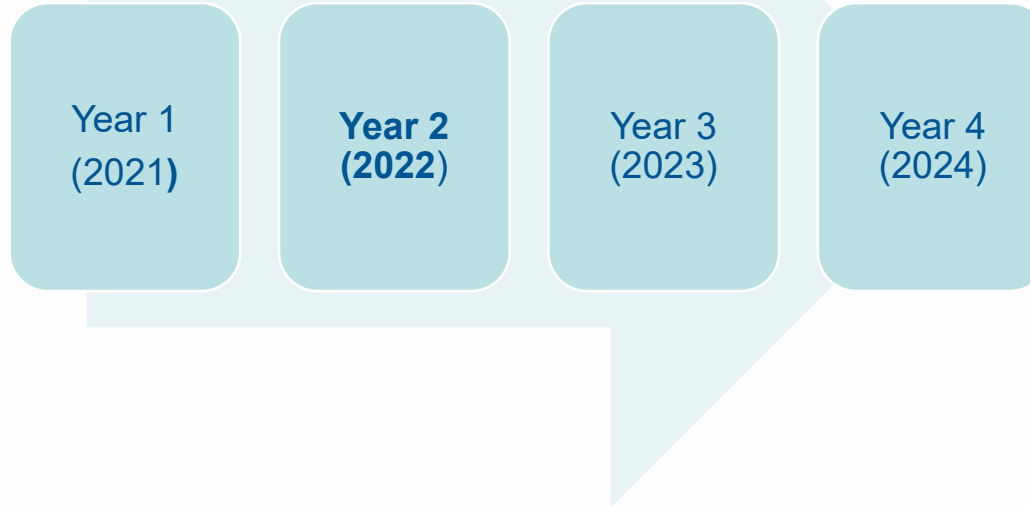
