The population increased 32,390, or 0.9 percent over 2008. The number of deaths decreased by 473. The rate decreased by 1.2 percent. The number of infant death decreased by 24. The rate decreased by 5.9 percent.
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The number of neonatal deaths increased by 2. The rate increased by 3.1 percent.
Oregon's average maternal death rate 2005-2009 (13.7) was 24.1 percent lower than the average U.S. rate for

Crude death rates are per 1,000 population; infant and neonatal rates per 1,000 live resident births; maternal death rate per 100,000 live resident births. In 2006, the method of calculating maternal death changed to include a longer time frame after the birth.
