## **Practice Guidance for Judicious Use of Antibiotics**

In the well-appearing patient, antibiotics are not the answer.

## The Use of CURB-65 for Determining Site of Care in Adults

The most recent British Thoracic Society scoring system for determining risk of mortality has the acronym CURB-65. It gives one point for each of the following: confusion, urea (BUN > 7), respiratory rate > 30, low blood pressure (systolic  $\leq 90$  or diastolic  $\leq 60$ ), and age  $\geq 65$ . Patients with a score of 0-1 have less then approximately 2% mortality and are likely safe to be treated as an outpatient. Patients with two or more points have greater than 9% mortality and should be admitted to the hospital for treatment. Patients with scores of 3 or more may benefit from intensive care treatment. Any scoring system is intended to be an aid to clinical judgment and should not override the clinical judgment of an experienced practitioner.
