

OREGON NOROVIRUS WATCH, JANUARY 2017. This issue of *Oregon Norovirus Watch* includes norovirus outbreak data from the 2016–2017 norovirus season. In the month of January 2017, 30 norovirus or norovirus-like outbreaks were reported, of which 22 (73%) were in nursing homes, 6 (20%) were in schools, 1



(3%) was in a restaurant and 1 (3%) was in another setting. Since January 2016, 123 (62%) of 198 lab-confirmed and norovirus-like outbreaks occurred in nursing homes or assisted-living facilities (Fig. 1). Over the last year, the GII.4 Sydney strain was identified in 8 (8%) of 96 lab-confirmed outbreaks. We have not seen a GII.4 Sydney norovirus outbreak since April 2016. We continue to see the number of other GII-strain outbreaks increase and have seen a marked increase in GII.4 Untypeable (Fig 2).
