# Homicide-Suicide in Oregon

# **Basic Facts**

- A homicide-suicide is one or more homicides with the subsequent suicide of the perpetrator.
- Homicide-suicide occurs mainly in intimate partnerships and families.
- Relationships between intimate partner victims and the perpetrators are often marked by abuse.
- On average, nine homicidesuicide events occur in Oregon each year.
- Most perpetrators of homi-• cide-suicide events are adult males; most victims are the perpetrator's current or former female intimate partner and/ or the perpetrator's child/children.
- About one in five homicidesuicide events are among adults age 65 and older.

#### Prevention

- Promote non-violence education
- Strengthen support for victims
- Encourage treatment for perpetrators
- Reduce perpetrator access to firearms

## From 2003 to 2012...

- 90 homicide-suicide events occurred in Oregon. These events resulted in 107 homicides and 90 suicides (197 deaths).
- Most homicide victims were women and children. .
- Nearly 85% of the Table 1. Demographics of victims and suspects, victims were killed by an intimate part ner or family mem ber. More than hal of the victims were killed by their cur rent/former spouse or boyfriend (Table 2).
- Firearms accounted for 87% of deaths in homicide-suicide events.
- Marital conflict, vio lence involving jeal ousy/lover's trian gles" are commoi factors.

health problems such as a mental disorder, alcohol/substance use problem and/or depressed mood.

- 55% of events among persons age 65 years and older involved declining physical health.
- 22% of perpetrators had job and/or finan cial problems.
