

Oregon Adolescents


- Oregon has about 771,000 adolescents (age 10-24)
- Youth make up about 18% of Oregon's population
- About 18% of adolescents live below the poverty line
 - Compared to 11% of all Oregonians
- Medicaid covers about 1 in 2 youth
- Youth are more racially/ethnically diverse than adults and seniors

Gender Identity of Oregon Youth





Race/Ethnicity of OR Youth (Grade 6/8/11)



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
Sexual Orientation of Oregon Youth




Mental Health Takeaways

- Youth suicide-related visits to urgent care & ER have been steady for the past 3 years
- However, Oregon youth are facing substantial mental health and wellness challenges
- The vast majority of youth have somewhere to go for help outside of school
- Queer, transgender, and to some extent female-identifying youth are experiencing significantly more distress and less adult support than males

Suicide-related visits to EDs and UCCs for youths ages 18 and under in the fourth quarter of 2021, were similar to 2019.



Seriously Contemplated Suicide in Past Year






Has Safe Place/Person Outside of School for Help


Has Safe Person/Place Outside of School


Youth Quotes | Mental Health

"Nothing too serious, just a little down. I think most people have felt the same."




School Climate & Connectedness


School Climate/ Connectedness Takeaways

- Most youth feel a teacher would notice if they were absent
- This is lower for youth who are older, BIPOC, queer, or transgender
- About 1 in 10 youth experienced schoolrelated bullying
- Queer, trans & rural/frontier youth were much more likely to experience bullying
- About 1 in 4 youth experience conflict/tension at school due to socioeconomic or demographic factors

If I am absent, a teacher/other adult at school will notice (% Strongly agree/agree)




11th gr: Teacher will notice if I'm absent (% Strongly agree/agree)




Teacher will notice if I'm absent

(% Strongly agree/agree)



At this school, there is conflict based on race, ethnicity, culture, religion, gender, sexual orientation or disability (% Strongly agree/agree)




6th grade: School Tension based on Race, Gender, etc. (% Strongly agree/agree)




School Tension based on Race, Gender, etc. (% Strongly agree/agree)



Was Bullied at School in past 30 days (including distance learning)





"I miss my friends and want to be social at school again. But don't worry. I am able to stay standing strong currently."




Substance Use

Substance use takeaways

- Youth reported lower recent substance use rates than in prior years
 - Several theories as to why but need more data and input from youth
- Transgender and bisexual youth reported significantly higher levels of substance use
- Asian and Pacific Islander youth had significantly lower rates of alcohol, marijuana and e-cigarette use

30-day Substance Use



Alcohol Use in Past 30 Days





E-cigarette Use in Past 30 Days






Effects of COVID

COVID Takeaways

- More than half of Oregon youth experienced negative economic, emotional and/or academic effects from the pandemic
- Female, transgender/gender diverse, and queer youth experienced disproportionate mental health and academic effects
- Keeping up with school due to technology was particularly difficult for youth in rural and frontier areas




Mental Health Impacts by Gender Identity


Mental Health Impacts by Sexual Orientation


Mental Health Impacts by Location


Difficulty Keeping Up w/School (tech/wifi)



Youth Quotes | COVID-19 Impact

"I had difficulty focusing on schoolwork because a person living in my home had to go to the hospital."

"I moved to a new place so I am unable to make human contact with anyone other than my family. There is literally no way for me to meet other people."

"My grandfather died. I had to take a few weeks off school to drive down and ended up failing several of my classes because of it."

"I got in my own head a lot overthinking, feeling alone, etc. [but] I was also able to find positives, and I was eating really well and working out every day for a while."

Youth Voice & Engagement

Youth Engagement Across Oregon

SHS Youth Data Council (YDC)

- Paid opportunity for youth ages 15-20 with experience in Oregon's public K-12 education system
 - Provide insight and guidance to improve the SHS
 - Address health equity and advance racial justice by amplifying the voices of *all* youth

ASH Youth Advisory Council (YAC)

- Youth-led, paid opportunity for youth ages 15-19
 - Overarching goal to increase health equity
 - Determine how to invest \$1 million for COVID-19 recovery in youth, schools, and communities
 - Applications now open! **Deadline: March 31, 2022**
