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TPEP's budget allocation for the 2017-2019 biennium is \$16.3 million, which is roughly a \$4 million reduction from the previous biennium.

The original TPEP budget proposal was presented to TRAC during the July 27<sup>th</sup> meeting. A webinar was held on September 20<sup>th</sup> to present the budget to TRAC members not able to attend the July meeting.

Discussion:

TRAC members were provided an overview of actions taken regarding the TPEP budget since the July TRAC meeting. This included consultation with the Conference of Local Health Officials (CLHO) regarding the TPEP funding strategy for counties. The CLHO representative stated that CLHO wants competitive grants to be eliminated to lessen the cut for counties. A work group comprised of state and county leadership representatives will be meeting over the next few weeks to discuss how the funds for counties will be allocated.

Members discussed how TPEP successes such as statewide Tobacco 21 and a strong Indoor Clean Indoor Air Act would be not possible without local communities working hard to promote policy change. TPEP evaluations show that the majority of policy changes have occurred in communities that received Sustainable Relationships for Community Health (SRCH) funds and Strategies for Policy and Environmental Change Tobacco Free funds.

Though there will not be any tobacco-specific SRCH grants, SRCH efforts will continue through funding from Centers for Disease Control and Prevention grants for hypertension, colorectal cancer, asthma, diabetes and other chronic conditions, many of which have tobacco as a risk factor.

Some members expressed concern about the high rate of tobacco use among American Indian/Alaska Natives in Oregon. It was noted that there is a gap in data for this population. OHA is partnering with the Northwest Portland Area Indian Health Board Epidemiology Center to identify methods for improving data collection. Members expressed interest in adding tribal representation to TRAC.

The committee discussed the proposed Tobacco 21 evaluation. It will examine potential reductions to youth initiation, and use of tobacco products among youth and young adults.

TOFCO, Inc. made a motion for TRAC to recommend the budget as presented. Oregon Association of Hospitals and Health Systems seconded the motion. HPCDP called roll for consensus, and the motion passed with unanimous support.

## Decision and Action Steps:

TRAC recommended the budget as presented. This is the budget proposal that will be brought to the Public Health Advisory Board in October.
