<u>Background</u>: During Summer 2017, OHA and CLHO committed to revisiting the CLHO TPEP funding formula to align with public health modernization strategies and to change tobacco prevention outcomes. The tiered funding model was developed in partnership with CLHO to advance tobacco prevention policy and systems change initiatives in communities with attention and focus to reducing tobacco-related health disparities. The model offers flexibility to nimbly deliver resources based on total tobacco prevention funding made available to OHA. It allows Local Public Health Authorities (LPHAs) to opt in at the level that best fits their agency's interest and capacity.
