






Tobacco tax revenue by fund or program, Oregon, 2017-2025





Tobacco tax revenue by fund, Oregon, 2017-2029









Governance

Currently:

Tobacco Reduction Advisory Committee (TRAC) –Measure 44 revenues

Community Advisory Group – Measure 108 revenues

Oregon Health Authority (OHA) desires an equitable governance structure reflecting all partners in the tobacco prevention system and with purview over tobacco program funding, including both M44 and M108 revenues.



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Senate Bill 587 brought tobacco retail licensing to Oregon

Locations requiring retailers to have a license to sell tobacco products over the counter (In effect as of March 31, 2021 (n=58))







Senate Bill 587: Statewide Tobacco Retail Licensing

- Passed during the 2021 legislative session, signed by Governor Brown on July 17, 2021.
- As of January 1, 2022, a license is required for each premises from which tobacco products and/or inhalant delivery systems are sold.
- Premises:
 - Must be fixed and permanent;
 - Not located in an area zoned exclusively for residential use;
 - Must meet qualifications for engaging in the sale of tobacco products or inhalant delivery systems enacted as an ordinance provided the Department has knowledge of the qualification.
- SB 587 also allowed for existing local licenses to continue and for localities to adopt stricter standards for tobacco retail sales.



Oregon Tobacco Retail License Program – State Agency Roles



Department of Revenue:

- Issue license, annually renew license;
- Collect fees associated with license;
- Suspend, revoke, refuse to issue or renew license;
- Information sharing.



Oregon Health Authority:

- Enforce state laws and rules on tobacco and inhalant delivery system sales;
- Establish database;
- Retailer education and outreach;
- Annual inspections;
- Technical assistance to local jurisdictions;
- Evaluation;
- Information sharing.



Local Jurisdictions:

- May keep local license program (if they already have one);
- May conduct education and outreach;
- May help enforce state and/or local tobacco retail laws;
- Information sharing.

Oregon Public Health Division

Program Implementation

- 2,625 state tobacco retail licensees with the Department of Revenue.
 - Multnomah, Clatsop, Benton, and Klamath Counties kept local licenses.
 - Lane County kept local restrictions but handed licensing to the state.
- Tobacco Retail License Rules effective February 10, 2022 (OAR 333-015).
- Minimum legal sales age inspections began August 17, 2022.
 - 353 inspections completed as of 10/7/22 with 88 violations
- Conference of Local Health Officials adopted Program Element for local enforcement September 2022.
- Program fully staffed as of October 4, 2022.
