3) Oregon Indoor Clean Air Act- Tara Weston and Ilana Kurtzig 1:20-1:50 (30)

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Objective: Provide an overview of the Indoor Clean Air Act (ICAA). Discuss the importance of protecting people from secondhand smoke by strengthening, and preventing exemptions in, the ICAA. Background: The Indoor Clean Air Act protects nearly every person in Oregon from the health risks of secondhand smoke and vapor. The law was strengthened in 2007 when exemptions were removed for bars, taverns and bowling alleys. Proposals are occasionally put forward to carve out exemptions to the ICAA that would weaken its public health protections.
