
CASES — Statewide





Community Transmission

Counties by Level of Community Transmission


Select a bar to highlight the counties in that level of community transmission.





Multiple Layers Improve Success

The Swiss Cheese Respiratory Pandemic Defense recognizes that no single intervention is perfect at preventing the spread of the coronavirus. Each intervention (layer) has holes.



Response and Prevention Recommendations

- Early intervention- This includes providing guidance for testing, infection control practices (e.g., cohorting, ventilation, PPE use), and access to vaccines and medical care.
- Isolation- 10 days;
- Residents of congregate living settings may return to work or school after completion of their 5-day isolation period provided they have been feverfree for at least 24 hours, their symptoms are improving, and they are able to mask while around other people for the remaining 5 days of their isolation period.
- Continue to isolate from other residents in the congregate living setting for the full 10-day isolation period.



Response and Prevention Recommendations

- Quarantine- 10 days ;Residents (regardless of vaccination status) and staff (who are not up to date on COVID-19 vaccination) of nonhealthcare congregate facilities
- Residents of non-healthcare congregate living settings who attend school or work outside of that setting are allowed to return to work or school after exposure to a confirmed or presumptive COVID-19 case, presuming that they remain asymptomatic
